## 1 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - FLOOR VERSION 2 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 3 1st Session of the 56th Legislature (2017) ENGROSSED SENATE 4 CONCURRENT 5 RESOLUTION NO. 3 By: Brecheen of the Senate 6 and 7 Park of the House 8 9 A Concurrent Resolution stating that Black Vultures have caused depredation in the cattle industry; stating Black Vultures are protected species; 10 describing an insufficient process to address the 11 depredation; urging the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service to ease restrictions and 12 limitations; and directing distribution. 13 14 15 WHEREAS, Black Vultures (coragyps atratus) have caused proven and documented depredation in the cattle industry specifically 16 preying on newborn calves; and 17 WHEREAS, Black Vultures are protected under the federal 18 Migratory Bird Treaty Act, administered by the United States Fish 19 20 and Wildlife Service (USFWS); and 21 WHEREAS, A Take Permit is available to producers through the 2.2 Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) of the United States Department of Agriculture; however, the permit process is not 23 24

1	sufficient to address needs in specific areas where depredation has
2	increased.
3	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION
4	OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
5	CONCURRING THEREIN:
6	THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature urges the Animal and Plant
7	Health Inspection Service (APHIS) of the United States Department of
8	Agriculture to ease the restrictions and limitations of the process
9	for the Take Permit and to increase the number of birds allowed
10	under the Take Permit specific to areas where birds are preying upon
11	calves.
12	THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to all Oklahoma
13	Congressional offices, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service
14	(USFWS), the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) and
15	to the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation.
