BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.508-4 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. As used in this section, "Individual Career and Academic Plan (ICAP)" means an individualized plan developed by the student and the student's parent or legal guardian, in collaboration with their school counselors, school administrators, teachers and other school personnel, that is used to help establish personalized academic and career goals, explore postsecondary career and educational opportunities, align coursework and curriculum, apply to

1 postsecondary institutions, secure financial aid and ultimately
2 enter the workforce.

3 B. As part of the multimeasures approach to high school
4 graduation recommended by the State Board of Education, pursuant to
5 Section 5 of House Bill No. 3218 passed by the Legislature in the
6 2nd Session of the 55th Legislature, the Board shall adopt a new
7 statewide system of college and career planning tools which shall be
8 known as the "Individual Career Academic Plan (ICAP)". The Board
9 shall work cooperatively with school districts to incorporate the
10 ICAP into graduation requirements.

11 1. Beginning with students entering the ninth grade in the
12 2019-2020 school year, each student shall be required to complete
13 the process of an ICAP in order to graduate from a public high
14 school with a standard diploma. Each year thereafter, students
15 shall annually update their ICAP. The ICAP shall include, but not
16 be limited to:

- 17 a. career- and college-interest surveys,
- 18 b. written postsecondary and workforce goals and
19 information of progress towards these goals,
- 20 c. intentional sequence of courses that reflect progress
21 toward the postsecondary goal,
- 22 d. the student's academic progress, including courses
23 taken, assessment scores, any remediation or credit
24 recovery and any Advanced Placement, International

- 1 Baccalaureate; concurrent or dual enrollment credits
2 earned and/or career certificate(s), certification(s),
3 or endorsements, and
4 e. experience in-service learning and/or work environment
5 activities.

6 2. The ICAP system shall be implemented according to the
7 following schedule:

- 8 a. for the 2017-2018 school year, the Oklahoma State
9 Department of Education shall work with school
10 districts, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
11 Education and the Oklahoma State Board of Career and
12 Technology Education to develop individual career
13 academic planning tools for students in grades six
14 through twelve,
15 b. for the 2018-2019 school year, the Department shall
16 incorporate the ICAP as described in paragraph 1 of
17 this subsection on a pilot program basis, and
18 c. for the 2019-2020 school year, and each school year
19 thereafter, school districts shall fully incorporate
20 and put into operation the ICAP as described in
21 paragraph 1 of this subsection for all students
22 entering the ninth grade.

23 C. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent a
24 district from implementing the ICAP for students in earlier grades.

1 D. ICAPs for students with disabilities, as defined in the
2 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), P.L. No. 105-17,
3 shall take into account and work in cooperation with the student's
4 individualized education program (IEP) or Section 504 Plan as
5 defined by the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, P.L. No. 93-112.

6 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
