1 and promulgated administrative rule, order destruction of records  
2 deemed to be no longer of value to the Bureau, excluding  
3 criminalistic and investigative records which shall forever be kept  
4 and maintained;

5 3. To report to the Commission at each regular meeting, or as  
6 directed by the Commission, the current workload of the Bureau.  
7 Such reports shall be submitted by category of the persons or  
8 entities authorized to initiate investigations as provided for in  
9 subsection A of Section 150.5 of this title, and any other category  
10 the Commission may request which does not violate the  
11 confidentiality restrictions imposed in Sections 150.1 through 152.9  
12 of this title. Such reports shall contain the following  
13 information:

- 14 a. what types of investigations are pending,
- 15 b. what new types of investigations have been opened,
- 16 c. what types of investigations have been closed, and
- 17 d. what criminal charges have been filed as a result of  
18 Bureau investigations.

19 The reports shall not contain any information on the individual  
20 subjects of the investigation or persons questioned in connection  
21 with an investigation. These reports shall be open for public  
22 inspection;

23 4. To designate positions, appoint employees and fix salaries  
24 of the Bureau, other than the salaries established by subsection A

1 of Section 150.6a of this title, and to authorize the payment of  
2 necessary certification expenses for the employees;

3 5. To authorize the purchase and issuance of uniforms for all  
4 law enforcement officers, criminalists, and other personnel of the  
5 Bureau as designated by the Director and to purchase and issue  
6 necessary equipment for all employees of the Bureau. All uniforms  
7 and equipment shall be used only in the performance of the official  
8 duties of the officers, criminalists or other personnel and shall  
9 remain the property of the Bureau except as otherwise provided by  
10 law; ~~and~~

11 6. To enter into local cooperative agreements with local law  
12 enforcement agencies for the purpose of appointing affiliate task  
13 force agents to assist the Bureau in the investigation of major  
14 crimes under the jurisdiction of the Bureau. Affiliate task force  
15 agents shall be employees and commissioned law enforcement officers  
16 of the local law enforcement agency entering into agreement with the  
17 Bureau and shall not be employees of the Bureau. Affiliate task  
18 force agents shall have general peace officer powers and the  
19 authority to arrest persons throughout the state while serving as an  
20 affiliate task force agent. Affiliate task force agents serve  
21 solely at the discretion and will of the Director. The Director may  
22 renew, suspend, or revoke any agreement appointing an affiliate task  
23 force agent at any time; and

1        7. To enter into cross deputization agreements with any  
2 federally recognized Indian Tribe or branch of the federal  
3 government.

4        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
