11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.6m of Title 70, unless
14	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
15	A. As used in this section:
16	1. "HIV" or "Human Immunodeficiency Virus," means a human
17	retrovirus known to cause AIDS; and
18	2. "AIDS" or "Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome," means the
19	final and most serious stage of HIV, causing damage to the immune
20	system and includes a number of opportunistic infections which can
21	result in death.
22	B. Each school district in the state shall provide age-
23	appropriate instruction about HIV, AIDS and related issues:
24	

- - 2. A minimum of once during the period from grade seven through nine; and
 - 3. A minimum of once during the period from grade ten through grade twelve, with heightened emphasis on modes of transmission, prevention methods, virology and relevant statistics.
 - C. The instruction shall include:

- 1. The definition of HIV and AIDS;
- 2. How the virus is transmitted;
- 3. How the virus is not transmitted;
- 4. An analysis of the transmission and methods of prevention
 for sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) and HIV, with an emphasis
 on abstinence from sex and intravenous drug use;
 - 5. Identification of risk behaviors and situations involving possible exposure to HIV;
 - 6. An analysis of the efficiency of artificial means of birth control and other methods in preventing the spread of HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases; and
 - 7. A demonstration of refusal skills, negotiating skills and peer resistance skills related to sexual health.
- D. The State Department of Education shall work in conjunction
 with the Department of Health to create or implement a medically
 accurate curriculum for HIV education. A school district may elect

1	to create or implement its own HIV education curriculum, provided
2	any curriculum must be approved by the State Department of Health
3	for medical accuracy.

4	E. All materials used for HIV education instruction shall be
5	made available for public inspection, either physically or digitally
6	on the district website, at least one month prior to instruction.
7	F. Any student may be exempt from this section by written
8	request of a parent or legal guardian.
9	SECTION 2. REPEALER 70 O.S. 2011, Section 11-103.3, is
LO	hereby repealed.
L1	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.
L2	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
L3	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
