12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1010.14 of Title 56, unless
15	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	A. Not less than thirty (30) days before conducting a program
17	integrity audit of any provider, the Oklahoma Health Care Authority
18	or its designee shall notify the provider in writing of the
19	impending program integrity audit.
20	B. The Authority shall provide for a peer-to-peer review
21	process of the initial program integrity audit report and the
22	preliminary findings of the program integrity audit before a request
23	for informal consideration or a request for a formal appeal.

- C. The Authority shall allow any applicant, recipient or provider to request a hearing up to forty-five (45) calendar days following the notification by the Authority of the adverse decision.
- D. With the goal of reducing Medicaid billing and coding errors, the Authority shall hold annual training seminars with each of the following entities:
 - 1. A statewide association representing allopathic physicians;
 - 2. A statewide association representing osteopathic physicians;
 - 3. A statewide association representing dentists;
 - 4. A statewide association representing nursing homes;
 - 5. A statewide association representing hospitals; and
 - 6. A statewide association representing pharmacists.

Training seminars shall be as comprehensive as possible and include a detailed written explanation of probability sampling methods used and extrapolation methods used.

- E. After the effective date of this act, the Authority shall not perform a program integrity audit of a provider until after the training seminar for that class of provider has been completed.
- SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
