BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11000 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

In order to collaborate, leverage resources, consolidate investigative services where applicable, promote efficiencies and provide enhanced services in the State of Oklahoma, the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) and the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control (OBNDD) are hereby directed to create opportunities of cooperation between the two agencies as follows:

1. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall enhance

1 cooperation, collaboration and deconfliction among law enforcement
2 agencies by data sharing through the "Augmented Criminal
3 Investigative Support System" (ACISS) Case Management System. The
4 shared data and case management between the agencies shall be used
5 to promote the flow of information among participating agencies, to
6 reduce duplication of law enforcement activities, and to provide an
7 automated process for information sharing of law enforcement
8 sensitive data in a timely and secure manner. OSBI will provide,
9 administer, operate and maintain OSBI ACISS and ACISS Fusion
10 pursuant to the Licensing Agreement and other applicable agreements
11 with the vendor and its agencies. OSBI will provide training, as
12 necessary for authorized users. OBNDD will provide OSBI with an
13 individual user agreement and other forms required by OSBI. OBNDD
14 will provide oversight and supervision to all agency personnel
15 sufficient to ensure compliance by all authorized users.

16 2. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma
17 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall foster an
18 understanding of each agency's role as it relates to information
19 collected during criminal investigations by promoting cooperation
20 between each agency in the real-time sharing and delivery of
21 sensitive investigative material that pertains specifically to each
22 agency's own unique investigative expertise and jurisdiction. OSBI
23 shall, when in the course of an OSBI investigation, OSBI Special
24 agents are made aware of information that has a drug nexus with

1 OBNDD's purview, OSBI will contact the appropriate OBNDD Agent in
2 Charge (AIC). Conversely, when during the course of an OBNDD
3 investigation, OBN agents are made aware of information that has a
4 nexus to an OSBI investigation or a crime that OSBI has the power
5 and duty to investigate, OBN will contact the appropriate OSBI
6 Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC).

7 3. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma
8 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall be directed to
9 leverage resources by consolidating regional office and laboratory
10 space around the State of Oklahoma. No later than December 31,
11 2019, OSBI and OBNDD shall share regional office space in the
12 following locations: Woodward, Tulsa, Lawton and McAlester. In
13 addition to OSBI and OBNDD, any Oklahoma Highway Patrol Troop
14 Headquarter expansion, relocation or new facility consideration
15 shall be required to collaborate with the investigative agencies in
16 order to provide a consolidated regional presence around the state
17 without duplication of resources. The directors of the
18 investigative agencies and the Chief of the Highway Patrol, along
19 with the Commissioner of Public Safety shall collaborate on location
20 choices and opportunities for shared resource services where
21 applicable.

22 4. Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and Oklahoma Bureau
23 of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall investigate combining

1 training elements of each agency to avoid duplication of facilities,
2 equipment and related expenses.

3 5. Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma
4 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall implement a
5 shared service and usage policy of unmanned aircraft systems and
6 other technology-driven investigative tools to order to maximize
7 equipment to be purchased and ensure usage of high quality
8 technology to assist in investigative services.

9 6. Within one (1) year of the effective date of this act,
10 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma Bureau of
11 Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall complete a thorough
12 examination of:

- 13 a. all fleet-related services of the two agencies,
- 14 b. all shared services of the two agencies, to include
15 the Human Resource Department, the Procurement
16 Department and Administrative Services Department, and
- 17 c. any other agency service or procedure that would be
18 applicable and make a report to the Legislature to
19 contain recommendations for cost-saving measures, to
20 include consolidation of services and changes to
21 structure and alignment of agency functions and
22 positions.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
