7	prohibiting taking person into custody under certain circumstances; prohibiting certain prosecutions;
8	prohibiting certain civil actions; defining term; providing for codification; and providing an

11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-309.1 of Title 63, unless
14	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
15	A. A peace officer may not take a person into custody based
16	solely on the commission of an offense involving prescription drugs
17	if the law enforcement officer, after making a reasonable
18	determination and considering the facts and surrounding
19	circumstances, reasonably believes that the following apply:
20	1. The law enforcement officer has contact with the person
21	because they were requesting emergency medical assistance for self
22	or another individual who reasonably appeared to be in need of
23	medical assistance due to a drug overdose; and
24	2. The person:

- a. provided the person's full name and other relevant information requested by the law enforcement officer,
 - b. was incapacitated and in need of medical assistance due to a drug overdose or remained at the scene with the individual who reasonably appeared to be in need of medical assistance due to a drug overdose until emergency medical assistance arrived, and
 - c. cooperated with emergency medical assistance personnel and law enforcement officers at the scene.
 - B. A person who meets the criteria of subsection A of this section shall not be subject to prosecution or receive a mitigated sentence for a drug offense or shall not have property seized or forfeited on the basis of a drug violation if evidence is obtained that they were seeking emergency medical assistance or intervening to prevent a drug overdose.
 - C. A person may not initiate or maintain an action against a peace officer or the employing political subdivision based on the officer's compliance or failure to comply with this section.
 - D. For the purposes of this section, "peace officer" shall have the same meaning as defined in Section 99 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- 22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
