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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5003.1a of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Upon the effective date of this act, the Oklahoma Department of Commerce is hereby consolidated with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor.

B. All assets, funds, liabilities, allotments, purchase orders, outstanding financial obligations, encumbrances, records, vehicles, equipment and other property of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall be transferred to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor.

C. Personnel employed by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce on the effective date of this act, shall be transferred to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor.

1 D. The classified and unclassified employees who are  
2 transferred pursuant to this section shall be subject to the  
3 following provisions:

4 1. Classified employees shall remain subject to the provisions  
5 of the Merit Protection System of Personnel Administration, as  
6 provided in the Oklahoma Personnel Act;

7 2. Unclassified employees transferred to the Office of the  
8 **Lieutenant Governor** shall remain in the unclassified service and  
9 shall serve at the pleasure of the Lieutenant Governor;

10 3. All employees who are transferred pursuant to this act shall  
11 retain leave, sick and annual time earned and any retirement and  
12 longevity benefits which have accrued during their employment with  
13 the state. The salaries of employees who are transferred shall not  
14 be reduced as a direct and immediate result of the transfer;

15 4. If the Office of the Lieutenant Governor should implement a  
16 reduction in force, all employees transferred pursuant to this act  
17 shall be credited for the time they were employed by the Oklahoma  
18 Department of Commerce; and

19 5. The transfer of employees shall be coordinated with the  
20 Office of the Lieutenant Governor.

21 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 5003.2, is  
22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 5003.2. A. Recognizing the geographic diversity of  
24 this state, Oklahoma needs one central, primary public-sector

1 economic development agency for the state in order to manage or  
2 coordinate all public sector economic development activity.

3 Oklahoma needs an agency to work at the community and firm level  
4 to:

5 1. Create new and higher quality jobs for the people of this  
6 state through the expansion, creation, restructuring and recruitment  
7 of export-oriented Oklahoma firms which produce value-added goods,  
8 services and processes;

9 2. Encourage statewide economic diversification and stability;

10 3. Maintain a two-way flow of information between the central  
11 state economic development agency and firms, farms and communities;

12 4. Implement the strategic economic development five-year plan;  
13 and

14 5. Carry out policy development and research in support of  
15 Oklahoma Futures.

16 B. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce is hereby ~~constituted an~~  
17 ~~agency of state government~~ a division of the Office of the  
18 Lieutenant Governor.

19 C. Whenever the terms "Department of Economic Development" or  
20 "Department of Economic and Community Affairs" appear in the  
21 Oklahoma Statutes they shall mean and refer to the Oklahoma  
22 Department of Commerce.

1        D. Rules promulgated prior to the effective date of this act by  
2 the Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall remain in full force and  
3 effect.

4        SECTION 3.        AMENDATORY        74 O.S. 2011, Section 5003.5, is  
5 amended to read as follows:

6        Section 5003.5. A. The Director of the Department of Commerce  
7 shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor with the advice and  
8 consent of the Senate. The Director shall serve at the pleasure of  
9 the ~~Governor~~ the Lieutenant Governor, and shall continue to serve  
10 until a successor is duly appointed and qualified, and shall report  
11 to the Lieutenant Governor. The salary of the Director shall be set  
12 by law.

13        B. The Director shall be qualified for such position by  
14 character, personality, ability, education, training and successful  
15 administrative experience in the public or private sector.

16        C. The Director shall employ such persons as are necessary to  
17 implement the powers and duties of the Department. Because many of  
18 the powers and duties of the Department involve working closely with  
19 the private sector, certain employee positions of the Department  
20 must be governed, classified and compensated in a manner that  
21 compares equally to similar positions in the private sector.  
22 Therefore, in the annual business plan, the Director shall list,  
23 describe and justify all such positions and their compensation and  
24 shall designate and place them in unclassified status, exempt from

1 the provisions of the Oklahoma Personnel Act. All other employees  
2 and positions shall be classified and subject to the provisions of  
3 the Merit System of Personnel Administration as provided in the  
4 Oklahoma Personnel Act. Provided, nothing in this section shall be  
5 construed to limit the authority of the Legislature to specify the  
6 status of positions otherwise by law. Neither shall the Director  
7 have the authority to circumvent, disregard or otherwise disobey  
8 specific provisions of law regarding positions in the Department.

9 D. The Director shall serve on the board of:

10 1. The Oklahoma Industrial Finance Authority;

11 2. The Oklahoma Science and Technology Research and Development  
12 Board;

13 3. The Oklahoma Development Finance Authority;

14 4. The Executive Bond Oversight Commission; and

15 5. The Oklahoma Ordnance Works Authority.

16 E. The Director may serve as administrator of any interlocal  
17 agreement or compact to pursue economic development and to assign  
18 any employees of the Department or employee personnel to carry out  
19 duties or obligations pursuant to any interlocal agreement or  
20 compact for economic development.

21 F. The Director, at his or her discretion, may approve payment  
22 for affiliations or memberships of the Department or, if necessary,  
23 associate memberships for individual employees in international,  
24

1 national, or state economic development councils, professional  
2 organizations, or governmental associations.

3 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 5012, as  
4 amended by Section 1027, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp.  
5 2017, Section 5012), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 5012. ~~A.~~ There is hereby created the "Oklahoma  
7 Department of Commerce Revolving Fund" for the division within the  
8 Office of the Lieutenant Governor known as the Oklahoma Department  
9 of Commerce. The fund shall consist of all monies, other than  
10 appropriated monies, received by the division of the Office of the  
11 Lieutenant Governor known as the Oklahoma Department of Commerce  
12 which are not directed to be placed into another fund. The fund  
13 shall be a continuing fund not subject to fiscal year limitations  
14 and shall be subject to the administrative direction of the ~~Oklahoma~~  
15 ~~Department of Commerce~~ Office of the Lieutenant Governor.  
16 Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the  
17 State Treasurer against claims submitted to the Director of the  
18 Office of Management and Enterprise Services. Monies in the fund  
19 may be expended for the operating expenses of the Department and  
20 shall be made pursuant to the laws of this state.

21 ~~B. On July 1, 1986, any unallotted cash balance in the funds~~  
22 ~~created in Sections 678 and 2008 of this title shall be transferred~~  
23 ~~to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce Revolving Fund. All~~  
24 ~~outstanding financial obligations and encumbrances of the funds~~

~~created in Sections 678 and 2008 of this title are hereby transferred to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce. After November 15, 1986, any unexpended balance in the funds created in Sections 678 and 2008 of this title shall be transferred to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce Revolving Fund.~~

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5003.3a of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is hereby created within the Oklahoma Department of Commerce the Oklahoma Board of Commerce, hereinafter referred to as the "Board".

B. The Board shall consist of six (6) members who shall serve a term of six (6) years. No more than one Board member shall be from any one county. The Lieutenant Governor shall serve as an ex officio voting member of the Commission.

C. Two members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

D. Two members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

E. Two members shall be appointed by the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce.

F. Whenever a vacancy on the Board occurs by death, resignation, or otherwise, the Lieutenant Governor shall fill the same by appointment, with the advice and consent of the Senate, and

1 the appointee shall hold office during the unexpired term. Each  
2 member shall hold office until a successor has been appointed and  
3 qualified. Four members of the Board shall constitute a quorum, and  
4 the vote of the majority of members present shall be necessary for  
5 any action to be taken by the Board. No vacancy in the membership  
6 of the Board shall impair the rights of a quorum to exercise and  
7 perform all the rights and duties of the Board.

8 G. Each member of the Board, before serving on the Board, shall  
9 take and subscribe to the constitutional and statutory oaths of  
10 office and file the oaths with the Secretary of State. Members of  
11 the Board shall be reimbursed for travel expenses to Board meetings  
12 as provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act of the Oklahoma  
13 Statutes.

14 H. The Board shall be organized by the Lieutenant Governor who  
15 shall appoint from the Board the Chair, the Vice Chair, and the  
16 Secretary. The Board is authorized and directed to adopt rules  
17 pursuant to the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act to  
18 execute the powers and duties of the Board and Department.

19 I. The Board may meet monthly and shall meet at least  
20 quarterly. The Board may meet at such other times as it deems  
21 necessary for effectively performing its duties and  
22 responsibilities. Special meetings may be called by the Chair or by  
23 any three members of the Board. The meetings of the Board shall be  
24 subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.

1 J. The Board is hereby declared to be a governmental agency and  
2 instrumentality of the State of Oklahoma with authority to exercise,  
3 in addition to those it now has, the rights, privileges and  
4 functions hereinafter specified.

5 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5003.3b of Title 74, unless  
7 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

8 There are hereby granted to and imposed in the Board, and in any  
9 commission or body which may hereafter succeed to the powers, rights  
10 and duties of the Board, the following additional powers, rights and  
11 duties:

12 1. Sue and be sued;

13 2. Adopt, use and alter an official seal;

14 3. Make bylaws for the management and regulation of its  
15 affairs;

16 4. Appoint, prescribe the duties and fix the compensation for  
17 officers, agents and employees;

18 5. Make contracts and execute instruments as in the judgment of  
19 the Board are necessary or convenient to the exercise of the powers  
20 conferred upon it by law; and

21 6. Promulgate rules and policies necessary and convenient to  
22 the exercise of the powers conferred upon it by law.

SECTION 7. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
