NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-131 of Title 70, unless there 12 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: Subject to the availability of funds, the State Department of 13 Education and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, 14 15 working in cooperation, shall: 1. Develop and implement programs to identify talented students 16 and recruit those students and other persons into the teaching 17 profession. Persons targeted for recruitment may include, but are 18 not limited to, high school and undergraduate students, mid-career 19 and retired professionals, honorably discharged and retired military 20 personnel and members of underrepresented gender and ethnic groups; 21 2. Develop and distribute materials that emphasize the 2.2 importance of the teaching profession and inform individuals about 23

state-funded loan forgiveness and tuition assistance programs;

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- 3. Give priority to developing and implementing recruitment programs to address the areas of teacher shortage identified and the recommendations made in the educator supply-and-demand study as required by Section 6-211 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The Department may use discretionary funds to carry out the provisions of this paragraph;
- 4. Encourage cooperation between the business community and school districts to develop recruitment programs designed to attract and retain capable teachers, including programs to provide summer employment opportunities for teachers; and
- 5. Encourage major education associations to cooperate in developing a long-range program promoting teaching as a prestigious, respected and desirable career and to assist in identifying local activities and resources that may be used to promote the teaching profession.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-132 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee authorized by Section 1 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 14 of the 1st Session of the 56th

  Oklahoma Legislature, for Oklahoma License to Educate license plates shall be deposited to the Oklahoma Teacher Recruitment Revolving

  Fund created in subsection B of this section.

1	B. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
2	fund for the State Department of Education to be designated the
3	"Oklahoma Teacher Recruitment Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a
4	continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall
5	consist of all monies received by the State Department of Education
6	pursuant to the provisions of subsection A of this section and any
7	donations, grants and gifts from any public or private source. All
8	monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated
9	and may be budgeted and expended by the State Department of
10	Education for the purpose of operating teacher recruitment programs
11	Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the
12	State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the
13	Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for
14	approval and payment.
15	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
16	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
17	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
18	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
19	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
