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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3218.2, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 208, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 3218.2), is amended to read as follows:

Section 3218.2. A. Resident tuition, nonresident tuition, and other fees to be required of students receiving instruction or other academic services provided by institutions of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall be established by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education with due regard for the provisions of Section 3218.14 of this title within limits prescribed by the Legislature. Nothing in this act shall be construed as limiting or prohibiting the requirement of payment for goods or services provided by auxiliary enterprises operated by or in

1 conjunction with institutions of The Oklahoma State System of Higher
2 Education and authorized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
3 Education.

4 B. By January 1 of each year, the Oklahoma State Regents for
5 Higher Education shall submit a report to the Governor, the
6 President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
7 Representatives, and the minority floor leaders and education
8 committee chairs of both houses of the Oklahoma Legislature and
9 shall make the report available to the public on the State Regents'
10 website and on the web portals data.ok.gov and documents.ok.gov in a
11 text-searchable and common electronic format. The annual report
12 shall include the following information:

13 1. Actions taken in regard to and the schedule of tuition and
14 fees approved for The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education for
15 the current academic year;

16 2. Data on the impact of any tuition or fee increases on the
17 ability of students to meet the costs of attendance, enrollment
18 patterns, availability of financial aid;

19 3. The budget prepared by the State Regents setting out in
20 detail the necessary expenses of the State Regents for the next
21 fiscal year;

22 4. The budget requests or proposals submitted by each
23 institution to the State Regents for the next fiscal year;

1 5. The funding formula or allotment system used by the State
2 Regents to allocate money to each institution, including a
3 description of the functional goals of the formula or system for
4 distributing funds to each institution;

5 6. A calculation of any differences in the budget requests
6 amounts for each institution and the actual amounts allocated to
7 each institution, including an explanation for any differences; and

8 7. Any other data considered relevant by the State Regents.

9 C. By January 1 of each year, each institution of The Oklahoma
10 State System of Higher Education shall submit a report to the
11 Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of
12 the House of Representatives, and the minority floor leaders and
13 education committee chairs of both houses of the Oklahoma
14 Legislature and shall make the report available to the public on
15 each institution's website and on the web portals data.ok.gov and
16 documents.ok.gov in a text-searchable and common electronic format.

17 The annual report shall include the following information:

18 1. A copy of reports submitted to the State Regents which
19 itemizes the tuition and fees for each institution by campus or
20 location; ~~and~~

21 2. The total budget of each institution for the previous fiscal
22 year including the amount of revenue received from tuition and fees
23 and other sources and expenses for each campus or location;

1 3. A list of all persons employed in a faculty or teaching
2 position, including adjunct instructors and teaching assistants, at
3 any time during the previous fiscal year, provided in a common
4 database format, and including for each such person the following
5 information:

6 a. the dollar amounts of salary, benefits and any pay for
7 approved non-institutional employment, and

8 b. the courses taught, including for each course the
9 title, number of credit hours and number of students
10 who completed the course; and

11 4. A report on the use of adjunct faculty, teaching assistants
12 or similarly situated persons to teach courses, describing how the
13 institution determines when to allow the use of such instructors to
14 teach courses, estimating the percentage of classes in each
15 department that are taught by adjunct faculty and the percentage of
16 classes that are taught by teaching assistants and describing the
17 methodology used to estimate those percentages.

18 ~~SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.~~

19 ~~SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation~~
20 ~~of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby~~
21 ~~declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and~~
