SENATE BILL NO. 384

An Act relating to driver licenses; providing for revocation for certain malicious offenses; providing period of revocation; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-205.3 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Department of Public Safety shall immediately revoke the driving privilege of any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age upon receiving a record of the person's conviction in any municipal, state or federal court within the United States of any of the following offenses, when such conviction has become final:

1. Malicious use of an explosive or incendiary device to damage property;

1 2. Conspiracy to injure or damage by use of an explosive or
2 incendiary device;

3 3. Making a false report concerning a destructive device in a
4 public building;

5 4. Perpetrating a hoax concerning a destructive device in a
6 public building;

7 5. Possessing or carrying a dynamite cartridge, bomb, grenade,
8 mine or powerful explosive on educational property; or

9 6. Causing, encouraging or aiding a minor to possess or carry a
10 dynamite cartridge, bomb, grenade, mine or powerful explosive on
11 educational property.

12 B. The period of revocation under this section shall be one (1)
13 year. Revocations under this section run concurrently with any
14 other revocation.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
