13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 166.7, as
14	amended by Section 839, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp.
15	2016, Section 166.7), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 166.7. A. There is hereby created in the State
17	Treasury a revolving fund for the Commission on Rehabilitation
18	Services, to be designated the "Rehabilitation Services Disbursing
19	Fund" provided that the fund may be designated by fiscal year
20	designations as the Commission may determine. The fund shall be a
21	continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations. The fund
22	shall consist of receipts from the federal government, monies
23	appropriated to the Department of Rehabilitation Services by the
24	State Legislature, and other receipts of the Department of

1 Rehabilitation Services as shall be directed by the Commission for

2 Rehabilitation Services. All monies accruing to the credit of said

3 | fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the

4 | Commission for Rehabilitation Services as may be necessary in order

5 to carry out the duties imposed upon the said Commission by law.

6 | Expenditures from the Rehabilitation Services Disbursing Fund shall

be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims

filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of

Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

B. The Department of Rehabilitation Services may direct all or a portion of federal and state funds received and appropriated for services to Older Individuals that are Blind (OIB) to qualified community-based, non-profit organizations accredited by the National Accreditation Council For Blind and Low Vision to administer, pursuant to contract, services for older individuals with vision impairments including, but not limited to, assisting in correcting or modifying visual disabilities including optical vision aids, inhome training, orientation and mobility, Braille instruction, adaptive skills training, information and referral, peer counseling

C. Funds received by the Commission for OIB Rehabilitation

Services from the Federal Rehabilitation Services Administration and

state matching funds may, in their entirety, be used to fund the

and other appropriate services designed to assist an older

individual who is blind with daily living activities.

3	D. Services provided by qualified Older Independent Blind
4	contractors may be dependent upon budget parameters and staffing.
5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.

8	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
