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L 4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L5	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.192, is
L 6	amended to read as follows:
L7	Section 1210.192. Any minor child, through the parent,
L8	guardian, or legal custodian of the child, may submit to the health
L 9	authority charged with the enforcement of the immunization laws of
20	this state:
21	1. A certificate of a licensed physician as defined in Section
22	725.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, stating that the
23	physical condition of the child is such that immunization would

endanger the life or health of the child; or

1	2. A written statement by the parent, guardian or legal
2	custodian of the child attesting that they have viewed the
3	information required by subsection B of this section and objecting
4	to immunization of the child;

- whereupon the child shall be exempt from the immunization laws of this state.
- B. A nonmedical exemption granted pursuant to paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section shall only be valid for two (2) school years and only after the parent or guardian:
- 1. Views information regarding the risks of not vaccinating their child and the possible medical complications resulting from vaccinations on a website maintained by the State Department of Health that provides a link to the center for disease control and prevention's "vaccine excipient and media summary"; provided, a parent or guardian with more than one child shall only be required to view the information once to satisfy the provisions of this subsection; and
- 2. Submits a document attesting that they have viewed the information required by this subsection, certifying that he or she has viewed the information specified in paragraph 1 of this subsection.
- 22 <u>C. The Department shall develop and maintain a stable Internet</u>
  23 <u>website to provide the information described in subsection B of this</u>
  24 section. No information regarding who uses the website shall be

1	collected or maintained by the Department. The website created
2	pursuant to this section shall:
3	1. Ensure that the materials and form described in subsection B
4	of this section are printable only after viewing information about
5	the risks of not vaccinating a child and the possible medical
6	complications resulting from vaccinations;
7	2. Provide clear and prominent instructions on how to receive
8	the information in printed form;
9	3. Be accessible to the public without requiring registration
10	or use of a user name, a password or another user identification;
11	<u>and</u>
12	4. Only contain information that conforms to the highest
13	standards of academic research, including but not limited to peer
14	review.
15	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
16	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
17	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
18	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
19	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
