11	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
12	1ST SESSION OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
13	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
14	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
15	the following proposed amendment to Section 57 of Article V of the
16	Oklahoma Constitution to read as follows:
17	Section 57. Every act of the Legislature shall embrace but one
18	subject, which shall be clearly expressed in its title, except
19	general appropriation bills, general revenue bills, and bills
20	adopting a code, digest, or revision of statutes; and no No law of
21	the Legislature shall be revived, amended, or the provisions thereof
22	extended or conferred, by reference to its title only; but so much
23	thereof as is revived, amended, extended, or conferred shall be re-
2.4	enacted and published at length: Provided, That if any subject be

embraced in any act contrary to the provisions of this section, such act shall be void only as to so much of the law as may not be expressed in the title thereof.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to Section 1 of Article XXIV of the Oklahoma Constitution to read as follows:

Section 1. Any amendment or amendments to this Constitution may be proposed in either branch of the Legislature, and if the same shall be agreed to by a majority of all the members elected to each of the two (2) houses, such proposed amendment or amendments shall, with the yeas and nays thereon, be entered in their journals and referred by the Secretary of State to the people for their approval or rejection, at the next regular general election, except when the Legislature, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of each house, shall order a special election for that purpose. If a majority of all the electors voting on any proposed amendment at such election shall vote in favor thereof, it shall thereby become a part of this Constitution.

No proposal for the amendment or alteration of this Constitution which is submitted to the voters shall embrace more than one general subject and the voters shall vote separately for or against each proposal submitted; provided, however, that in the submission of proposals for the amendment of this Constitution by articles, which

1	embrace one general subject, each proposed article shall be deemed a
2	single proposal or proposition.
3	SECTION 3. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
4	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this act shall be in the
5	following form:
6	BALLOT TITLE
7	Legislative Referendum No State Question No
8	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
9	This measure amends the State Constitution. The current law
10	requires that an act of the Legislature is to contain one
11	subject. The law also provides exceptions to that requirement.
12	The current law also requires that any proposed amendment to the
13	Constitution also pertain to one subject. The change would
14	remove the one subject requirements and the exceptions. The
15	measure also removes unnecessary language as it relates to
16	removal of the legislative requirement.
