6	A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or
7	rejection a proposed amendment to Section 3 of Article VII of the Oklahoma Constitution; requiring
8	partisan elections for certain judicial officers;  providing ballot title; and directing filing.

11	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
12	1ST SESSION OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
13	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
14	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
15	the following proposed amendment to Section 3 of Article VII of the
16	Oklahoma Constitution to read as follows:
17	Section 3. From each of the Supreme Court districts and Court
18	of Criminal Appeals districts, the voters thereof shall elect a
19	Justice of the Supreme Court and a Judge of the Court of Criminal
20	Appeals at a <del>non-partisan</del> <u>partisan</u> election, in a manner provided by
21	statute. In the event intermediate appellate courts are created,
22	the judges thereof shall be elected at a <del>non-partisan</del> <u>partisan</u>
23	election, in a manner provided by statute. In the event of a
24	vacancy the Governor shall, by appointment from said district, fill

1	such vacancy until the next election for State Officers, and at such
2	election the vacancy for the unexpired term shall be filled by a
3	non-partisan partisan election in a manner provided by statute.
4	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
5	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
6	the following form:
7	BALLOT TITLE
8	Legislative Referendum No State Question No
9	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
10	This measure would amend Section 3 of Article 7 of the Oklahoma
11	Constitution. It would require Supreme Court justices and Court
12	of Criminal Appeals judges to be elected in partisan elections.
13	It would require intermediate appellate judges to be elected in
14	partisan elections.
15	SHALL THE PROPOSAL BE APPROVED?

18	SECTION 3. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall,
19	immediately after the passage of this resolution, prepare and file
