SENATE BILL 1023

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to law enforcement training; authorizing the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training to conduct training for certain noncommissioned attendees; authorizing training tuition and fees to be set by the Council; directing deposit of tuition and fees; requiring certain minimum requirements be met; authorizing emergency rule making; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3311.16 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) is authorized to conduct full-time Basic Peace Officer Certification Academies and other law enforcement related training for individuals not commissioned or appointed by a law enforcement agency under rules established by the Council.

B. The tuition and/or fees for attending the Basic Peace Officer Certification Academies and/or other law enforcement related training will be at a rate established by CLEET and approved by the

1 Council. Tuition and/or fees charged under this section will be
2 deposited in the Peace Officer Revolving Fund established in Section
3 3311.7 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

4 C. Individuals not commissioned or appointed by a law
5 enforcement agency who are trained in the Basic Peace Officer
6 Certification Academies will be required to meet minimum
7 requirements established for peace officers as set forth in Section
8 3311 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Any fees relating to
9 meeting these requirements shall be the responsibility of the
10 individual. Individuals applying for the Academies will be required
11 to submit a fingerprint check to CLEET prior to acceptance.

12 D. The Council is authorized to promulgate emergency rules to
13 effectuate the provisions of this subsection.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
