6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to the Electrical License Act;  
8 amending 59 O.S. 2011, Sections 1682, 1685, 1686,  
9 1688 and 1689, as amended by Section 23, Chapter 313,  
10 O.S.L. 2015 (59 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 1689) which  
11 relate to definitions, licenses, apprentices,  
12 registration certificates, license renewals, and  
13 Electrical Hearing Board; adding definitions,  
14 modifying terms; authorizing license for certain  
15 apprentices; setting qualifications for certain  
16 license; authorizing registration of student  
17 electrical intern; setting fee; establishing  
18 continuing education hours; providing procedure to  
19 count maximum apprentices on jobsite; directing  
20 amendment of certain rules; providing for  
21 codification; providing for noncodification; and  
22 providing an effective date.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1682, is  
19 amended to read as follows:

20 Section 1682. As used in the Electrical License Act:

21 1. "Board" means the Construction Industries Board;

22 2. "Committee" means the Committee of Electrical Examiners  
23 appointed by the Board;

1        3. "Electrical apprentice" means any person sixteen (16) years  
2 of age or older whose principal occupation is the learning of and  
3 assisting in the installation of electrical work under the direct  
4 supervision of a licensed journeyman electrician or electrical  
5 contractor and who complies with the requirements of Section 1686 of  
6 this title;

7        4. "Journeyman electrician" means any person other than an  
8 electrical contractor who engages in the actual installation,  
9 alteration, repair or renovation of electrical facilities or  
10 electrical construction work unless specifically exempted by the  
11 provisions of the Electrical License Act;

12        5. "Electrical contractor" means any person skilled in the  
13 planning, superintending and practical installation of electrical  
14 facilities who is familiar with the laws, rules and regulations  
15 governing such work. Electrical contractor also means any  
16 individual, firm, partnership, corporation, limited liability  
17 company, or business performing skills of an electrical contractor  
18 or an electrician or the business of contracting, or furnishing  
19 labor or labor and materials for the installation, repair,  
20 maintenance or renovation of electrical facilities or electrical  
21 construction work according to the provisions of the Electrical  
22 License Act;

23        6. "Electrical facilities" means all wiring, fixtures,  
24 appurtenances, and appliances for, and in connection with, a supply

1 of electricity within or adjacent to any building, structure or  
2 conveyance on the premises but not including the connection with a  
3 power supply meter or other power supply source;

4 7. "Category" means the classification by which licenses and  
5 electrical work may be limited. Such categories shall include but  
6 shall not be limited to installation, maintenance, repair,  
7 alteration, residential, oilfield, and commercial;

8 8. "Temporary journeyman electrician" means any person other  
9 than a person permanently licensed as a journeyman electrician or  
10 electrical contractor in this state who meets the temporary  
11 licensure requirements of Section 1685.1 of this title;

12 9. "Variance and Appeals Board" means the Oklahoma State  
13 Electrical Installation Code Variance and Appeals Board; ~~and~~

14 10. "Electrical construction work" means installation,  
15 fabrication or assembly of equipment or systems included in  
16 "premises wiring" as defined in the National Electrical Code  
17 (reference 158:40-1-4. Standard of Installation), and which is  
18 hereby adopted and incorporated by reference. Electrical  
19 construction work includes, but is not limited to, installation of  
20 raceway systems used for any electrical purposes, and installation  
21 of field-assembled systems such as ice and snow melting, pipe-  
22 tracing, and manufactured wiring systems. Electrical construction  
23 work shall not include in-plant work performed by employees of the  
24 company owning the plant, work performed by telecommunications

employees for telecommunications companies, or installation of factory-assembled appliances or machinery which is not part of the premises wiring unless wiring interconnections external to the equipment are required in the field;

11. "Student electrical intern" means any person sixteen (16) years of age or older who complies with the requirements for registration under Section 1686 of this title; and

12. "Licensed electrical apprentice" means any person who can demonstrate ten thousand (10,000) hours of experience as an electrical apprentice and who complies with the requirements for registration under Section 1686 of this title.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1685, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1685. A. The Construction Industries Board shall issue a license as journeyman electrician or electrical contractor to any person who:

1. Has been certified by the Committee of Electrical Examiners as either having successfully passed the appropriate examination or having a valid license issued by another governmental entity with licensing requirements similar to those provided in the Electrical License Act;

2. Has paid the license fee and otherwise complied with the provisions of the Electrical License Act; and

1        3. Has, when required by the Board, provided such documents,  
2 statements or other information as may be necessary to submit to a  
3 national criminal history record check as defined by Section 150.9  
4 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

5        B. The Construction Industries Board shall issue a license as a  
6 licensed electrical apprentice to any person who has been certified  
7 by the Committee of Electrical Examiners as having ten thousand  
8 (10,000) or more verifiable hours of experience as an electrical  
9 apprentice and who has paid the license fee and otherwise complied  
10 with the provisions of the Electrical License Act. The fee for  
11 licensure as a licensed electrical apprentice shall be the same as  
12 for registration of electrical apprentices.

13        C. All licenses shall be nontransferable and it shall be a  
14 misdemeanor for any person licensed under the provisions of the  
15 Electrical License Act to loan or allow the use of such license by  
16 any other person, firm or corporation, except as specifically  
17 provided in the Electrical License Act.

18        SECTION 3.        AMENDATORY        59 O.S. 2011, Section 1686, is  
19 amended to read as follows:

20        Section 1686. A. The Construction Industries Board shall, upon  
21 proper application and payment of fee, register as an electrical  
22 apprentice and issue a certificate of such registration to any  
23 person who furnishes satisfactory proof to the Board that the  
24 applicant is:

1        1. Sixteen (16) years of age or over; and

2        2. Enrolled in a school or federal training program for  
3        electrical apprentices recognized by the Board, or employed as an  
4        electrical apprentice with an active licensed electrical contractor.

5        B. The Constructions Industries Board shall, upon proper  
6        application and payment of fee, register as a student electrical  
7        intern and issue a certificate of such registration to any person  
8        who furnishes satisfactory proof to the Board that the applicant is:

9        1. Sixteen (16) years of age or older; and

10       2. Enrolled in high school and enrolled in a work-ready or  
11       similar program recognized by the Board.

12       The fee for registration as a student electrical intern shall be  
13       one-half the amount of the fee for registration of an electrical  
14       apprentice.

15       C. All applications for examination, license or renewal of  
16       license shall be made in writing to the Board on forms provided, if  
17       necessary, by the Board. All applications shall be accompanied by  
18       the appropriate fee.

19       ~~C.~~ D. Apprentices and student electrical interns, when required  
20       by the Board, shall provide such documents, statements or other  
21       information as may be necessary to submit to a national criminal  
22       history record check as defined by Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the  
23       Oklahoma Statutes.

1       SECTION 4.       AMENDATORY       59 O.S. 2011, Section 1688, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3       Section 1688. A. No license shall be issued for longer than  
4 one (1) year, and all licenses shall expire on the last day in the  
5 birth month of the licensee. A license may be renewed upon  
6 application and payment of fees thirty (30) days preceding or  
7 following the date the license is due. Licenses renewed more than  
8 thirty (30) days following the date of expiration may be renewed  
9 only upon application and payment of all required fees and payment  
10 of any penalty for late renewal established by the Board and upon  
11 compliance with any applicable continuing education requirements  
12 established by the Board and this act. No penalty for late renewal  
13 shall be charged to any holder of a license which expires while the  
14 holder is in military service, if an application for renewal is made  
15 within one (1) year following the service discharge of the holder.

16       B. No licensed electrical apprentice, journeyman or contractor  
17 license shall be renewed unless the licensee has completed the  
18 required hours of continuing education, as determined and approved  
19 by the Committee of Electrical Examiners and approved by the  
20 Construction Industries Board. The required hours of continuing  
21 education for a licensed electrical apprentice shall be the same as  
22 required for a journeyman.

23       C. An apprentice registration certificate or a student  
24 electrical intern registration certificate shall be issued for one

1 (1) year, at which time the apprentice may reregister upon meeting  
2 the requirements of the Construction Industries Board and paying the  
3 renewal fee.

4 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1689, as  
5 amended by Section 23, Chapter 313, O.S.L. 2015 (59 O.S. Supp. 2017,  
6 Section 1689), is amended to read as follows:

7 Section 1689. A. The Construction Industries Board or its  
8 designee and the Committee of Electrical Examiners shall act as the  
9 Electrical Hearing Board and shall comply with the provisions of  
10 Article II of the Administrative Procedures Act, Section 308a et  
11 seq. of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

12 B. Any administrative hearing on suspensions, revocations or  
13 fines shall be conducted by a hearing examiner appointed by the  
14 Board. The hearing examiner's decision shall be a final decision  
15 which may be appealed to a district court in accordance with the  
16 Administrative Procedures Act.

17 C. The Electrical Hearing Board may, upon its own motion, and  
18 shall, upon written complaint filed by any person, investigate the  
19 business transactions of any electrical contractor, journeyman  
20 electrician or, electrical apprentice, licensed electrical  
21 apprentice, student electrical intern, or poultry house contractor  
22 license. Upon a finding by clear and convincing evidence, the Board  
23 shall suspend or revoke any license or registration obtained by  
24 false or fraudulent representation. Upon a finding by clear and



1 convincing evidence, the Board shall also suspend or revoke any  
2 license or registration for any of the following:

3 1. Making a material misstatement in the application for a  
4 license or registration, or the renewal of a license or  
5 registration;

6 2. Loaning or illegally using a license;

7 3. Demonstrating incompetence to act as a journeyman  
8 electrician or electrical contractor;

9 4. Violating any provisions of the Electrical License Act, or  
10 any rule or order prescribed by the Board or any ordinance for the  
11 installation of electrical facilities made or enacted by a city or  
12 town by authority of the Electrical License Act;

13 5. Willfully failing to perform normal business obligations  
14 without justifiable cause; or

15 6. Failing to maintain a registration or license as required by  
16 law in another state while registered in this state as a nonresident  
17 contractor.

18 D. Any person whose license or registration has been revoked by  
19 the Electrical Hearing Board may apply for a new license one (1)  
20 year from the date of such revocation.

21 E. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a political  
22 subdivision of this state that has adopted a nationally recognized  
23 electrical code and appointed an inspector pursuant to the  
24 provisions of Section 1693 of this title or pursuant to the

1 provisions of the Oklahoma Inspectors Act for such work shall have  
2 jurisdiction over the interpretation of the code and the  
3 installation of all electrical work done in that political  
4 subdivision, subject to the provisions of the Oklahoma Inspectors  
5 Act. Provided, a state inspector may work directly with an  
6 electrical contractor, journeyman electrician or electrical  
7 apprentice, licensed electrical apprentice or student electrical  
8 intern in such a locality if a violation of the code creates an  
9 immediate threat to life or health.

10 F. In the case of a complaint about, investigation of, or  
11 inspection of any license, registration, permit or electrical work  
12 in any political subdivision of this state which has not adopted a  
13 nationally recognized electrical code and appointed an inspector  
14 pursuant to the provisions of Section 1693 of this title or pursuant  
15 to the provisions of the Oklahoma Inspectors Act for such work, the  
16 Construction Industries Board shall have jurisdiction over such  
17 matters.

18 G. 1. No individual, business, company, corporation,  
19 association or other entity subject to the provisions of the  
20 Electrical License Act shall install, modify or alter electrical  
21 facilities in any incorporated area of this state which has not  
22 adopted a nationally recognized electrical code and appointed an  
23 inspector pursuant to the provisions of Section 1693 of this title  
24 or pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Inspectors Act for

1 such work without providing notice of such electrical work to the  
2 Construction Industries Board. A notice form for reproduction by an  
3 individual or entity required to make such notice shall be provided  
4 by the Construction Industries Board upon request.

5 2. Notice to the Construction Industries Board pursuant to this  
6 subsection shall not be required for electrical maintenance or  
7 replacement of existing electrical appliances or fixtures or of any  
8 petroleum refinery or its research facilities.

9 3. Enforcement of this subsection is authorized pursuant to the  
10 Electrical License Act, or under authority granted to the  
11 Construction Industries Board.

12 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1699 of Title 59, unless there  
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 A. As long as a journeyman or electrical contractor is on the  
16 jobsite, no licensed electrical apprentice shall be counted against  
17 the maximum number of apprentices who are allowed by law, rule or  
18 regulation to work under the supervision of a single journeyman or  
19 contractor.

20 B. A licensed electrical apprentice shall not be allowed to  
21 supervise a student electrical intern or an electrical apprentice.

22 C. One student electrical intern shall be allowed to work on a  
23 jobsite under a single journeyman or electrical contractor;  
24 provided, however, that no such student electrical intern shall be

1 counted against the maximum number of apprentices who are allowed by  
2 law, rule or regulation to work under the supervision of a single  
3 journeyman or contractor.

4 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
5 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

6 The Construction Industries Board shall amend its rules,  
7 wherever applicable, to conform to the provisions of this act.

8 SECTION 8. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
