NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3218.7-2 of Title 70, unless 20 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 21 A. For the purposes of this section, "certified classroom 22 23 teacher" means any certified, full-time teacher who is employed by a

public school district in this state and spends seventy-five percent

(75%) of his or her school day in the classroom. "Certified classroom teacher" does not include administrators, counselors or support employees.

- B. 1. Beginning July 1, 2018, a certified classroom teacher shall be eligible to earn a tuition waiver worth twelve (12) credit hours of resident tuition each year the teacher is employed by a public school district to be used for the postsecondary education of the teacher's child or children, subject to the eligibility criteria of subsection D of this section.
- 2. The child of a certified classroom teacher shall be eligible to use the tuition waiver provided pursuant to this section at an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education after the teacher has been employed by a public school district for a minimum of ten (10) years. The teacher shall not be required to teach at the same public school district for ten (10) years.
 - 3. a. The child of a certified classroom teacher who has been employed by a public school district for a minimum of ten (10) years may begin using the tuition waiver provided pursuant to this section at an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education beginning the semester after the certified classroom teacher has completed ten (10) years of teaching at a public school district.

b. The child of a certified classroom teacher who leaves public school district employment prior to attaining fifteen (15) years of employment shall be eligible to use a tuition waiver provided pursuant to this section at an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education only for the time period between meeting the requirements of subparagraph a of this paragraph and the certified classroom teacher's departure from public school district employment. Any tuition waiver earned and not used after the certified classroom teacher's departure from public school district employment shall be considered forfeit.

- c. The child of a certified classroom teacher who attains fifteen (15) years of public school district employment shall be guaranteed the use of the tuition waiver provided pursuant to this section at an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.
- 4. The State Regents for Higher Education shall verify the employment status and history of a certified classroom teacher with the State Board of Education before awarding any tuition waiver pursuant to this section.
- C. 1. Beginning July 1, 2018, a currently employed certified classroom teacher who has been employed by a public school district

for ten (10) years shall be provided a tuition waiver worth sixty (60) credit hours of resident tuition. On the effective date of this act, a certified classroom teacher who has been employed by a public school district for more than ten (10) years shall be provided an additional tuition waiver worth six (6) credit hours of resident tuition for each additional year of public school district employment up to twenty (20) years, or a maximum of one hundred twenty (120) credit hours of resident tuition. The teacher shall not be required to have been employed by the same public school district for the ten (10) or more years.

- 2. Beginning July 1, 2018, a certified classroom teacher who has been employed by a public school district for ten (10) or more years shall be eligible to earn a tuition waiver worth twelve (12) credit hours of resident tuition each year the teacher is employed by a public school district.
- 3. The tuition waivers provided in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this subsection may be used for the postsecondary education of the teacher's child or children, subject to the eligibility criteria of subsection D of this section.
- D. To be eligible to use the tuition waivers provided pursuant to this section, the child of a certified classroom teacher shall:
- 1. Be a resident of this state or be enrolled in a school district located in this state that serves students who reside in

both this state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract as authorized by Section 5-117.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

- 2. Be a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United States. A student who is not a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United States shall not be eligible for a tuition waiver pursuant to this section;
 - 3. a. Have graduated within the previous three (3) years from a high school accredited by the State Board of Education, or the Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics, with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in grades nine through twelve,
 - b. have graduated within the previous three (3) years from a high school not accredited by the State Board of Education with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in grades nine through twelve and have achieved a composite score of 22 or higher on the ACT test, or
 - c. have satisfactorily completed within the previous

 three (3) years an educational program that was

 provided through means other than a public or private

 school and have achieved a composite score of 22 or

 higher on the ACT test;

4. Have completed the curricular requirements for admission to an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education and one additional unit or set of competencies in a course that meets college admission requirements. The curriculum requirements shall include two units or sets of competencies in foreign or non-English language or technology courses that meet the college admission requirements and one unit or set of competencies of a fine arts course. Students shall also have attained a 2.5 grade point average in the core curriculum courses. Students who attended a high school which did not offer all the core curriculum courses or students who were educated by other means and were not offered all the core curriculum courses shall be allowed to satisfy this curriculum requirement by participating in a program approved by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for remediation of high school curricular deficiencies; and

- 5. Have satisfied admission to, and enrolled in, an institution which is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.
- E. A tuition waiver provided for in this section shall not be allowed for courses taken in excess of the requirements for completion of a baccalaureate program or taken more than eight (8) years after the student's first semester of enrollment in an institution of higher education.
- F. The State Regents for Higher Education shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section.
