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L3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L 4	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
L 5	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
L 6	A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall, in conjunction
L7	with the Department of Human Services, study and make
L8	recommendations to the Legislature on potential ways to reduce
L 9	program costs of the state Medicaid program without jeopardizing
20	vital services. The Authority's and Department's study shall
21	include, but not be limited to:
22	1. Ways to reduce program costs of the State Medicaid program
23	without jeopardizing vital services;

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- 2. Ways to reduce recipient waste, fraud and abuse in the state Medicaid program;
 - 3. Ways to modernize and improve the state Medicaid program through waivers from the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services;
- 4. Eligibility as a percentage of the federal poverty level in each population covered under the state Medicaid program, compared to other states;
 - 5. Models of other state Medicaid programs; and
 - 6. Medicaid reimbursement rates in other states.
- B. The Authority and the Department shall submit a report of their findings and recommendations no later than October 31, 2019, to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
