6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to investigative agencies
8 consolidation; directing Oklahoma State Bureau of
9 Investigation and Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and
10 Dangerous Drugs Control to create opportunities of
11 cooperation; directing shared data case management
12 systems; directing sharing of nexus information;
13 directing consolidation of certain office space;
14 providing for codification; and providing an
15 effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11000 of Title 74, unless there
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 In order to collaborate, leverage resources, consolidate
19 investigative services where applicable, promote efficiencies and
20 provide enhanced services in the State of Oklahoma, the Oklahoma
21 State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) and the Oklahoma Bureau of
22 Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control (OBNDD) are hereby directed to
23 create opportunities of cooperation between the two agencies as
24 follows:

1 1. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma
2 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall enhance
3 cooperation, collaboration and deconfliction among law enforcement
4 agencies by data sharing through the "Augmented Criminal
5 Investigative Support System" (ACISS) Case Management System. The
6 shared data and case management between the agencies shall be used
7 to promote the flow of information among participating agencies, to
8 reduce duplication of law enforcement activities, and to provide an
9 automated process for information sharing of law enforcement
10 sensitive data in a timely and secure manner. OSBI will provide,
11 administer, operate and maintain OSBI ACISS and ACISS Fusion
12 pursuant to the Licensing Agreement and other applicable agreements
13 with the vendor and its agencies. OSBI will provide training, as
14 necessary for authorized users. OBNDD will provide OSBI with an
15 individual user agreement and other forms required by OSBI. OBNDD
16 will provide oversight and supervision to all agency personnel
17 sufficient to ensure compliance by all authorized users.

18 2. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma
19 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall foster an
20 understanding of each agency's role as it relates to information
21 collected during criminal investigations by promoting cooperation
22 between each agency in the real-time sharing and delivery of
23 sensitive investigative material that pertains specifically to each
24 agency's own unique investigative expertise and jurisdiction. OSBI

1 shall, when in the course of an OSBI investigation, OSBI Special
2 agents are made aware of information that has a drug nexus with
3 OBNDD's purview, OSBI will contact the appropriate OBNDD Agent in
4 Charge (AIC). Conversely, when during the course of an OBNDD
5 investigation, OBN agents are made aware of information that has a
6 nexus to an OSBI investigation or a crime that OSBI has the power
7 and duty to investigate, OBN will contact the appropriate OSBI
8 Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC).

9 3. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma
10 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall be directed to
11 leverage resources by consolidating regional office and laboratory
12 space around the State of Oklahoma. No later than December 31,
13 2019, OSBI and OBNDD shall share regional office space in the
14 following locations: Woodward, Tulsa, Lawton and McAlester. In
15 addition to OSBI and OBNDD, any Oklahoma Highway Patrol Troop
16 Headquarter expansion, relocation or new facility consideration
17 shall be required to collaborate with the investigative agencies in
18 order to provide a consolidated regional presence around the state
19 without duplication of resources. The directors of the
20 investigative agencies and the Chief of the Highway Patrol, along
21 with the Commissioner of Public Safety shall collaborate on location
22 choices and opportunities for shared resource services where
23 applicable.

1 4. Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and Oklahoma Bureau
2 of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall investigate combining
3 training elements of each agency to avoid duplication of facilities,
4 equipment and related expenses.

5 5. Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma
6 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall implement a
7 shared service and usage policy of unmanned aircraft systems and
8 other technology-driven investigative tools to order to maximize
9 equipment to be purchased and ensure usage of high quality
10 technology to assist in investigative services.

11 6. Within one (1) year of the effective date of this act,
12 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma Bureau of
13 Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall complete a thorough
14 examination of:

- 15 a. all fleet-related services of the two agencies,
- 16 b. all shared services of the two agencies, to include
17 the Human Resource Department, the Procurement
18 Department and Administrative Services Department, and
- 19 c. any other agency service or procedure that would be
20 applicable and make a report to the Legislature to
21 contain recommendations for cost-saving measures, to
22 include consolidation of services and changes to
23 structure and alignment of agency functions and
24 positions.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
