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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2006 of Title 25, unless there
16	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Parental Rights
18	Immunization Act".
19	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2007 of Title 25, unless there
21	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
22	Each health care provider who administers a vaccine set forth in
23	the Vaccine Injury Table, as established by the United States
24	Department of Health and Human Services, shall obtain informed

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    consent from the legal representative or other adult authorized by
    law to consent on behalf of a minor to whom such provider intends to
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    administer such vaccine. Prior to administering the vaccine, the
    health care provider shall provide relevant information regarding
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    benefits and risks of the vaccine as well as information concerning
    the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program. Providing a copy
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    of the Vaccine Information Statement, the source of which is clearly
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    identified, and making available for review the Centers for Disease
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    Control and Prevention's "Epidemiology and Prevention of Vaccine-
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    Preventable Diseases: Vaccine Excipient and Media Summary", the
    Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Vaccine Injury Table or
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    the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Contraindications
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    and Precautions or any combination of these three resources to the
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    legal representative or other adult authorized by law to consent on
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    behalf of a minor shall constitute a minimum standard of relevant
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    information.
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        SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
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
