Supp. 2016, Section 63.8), which relates to agreements for vocational rehabilitation 14 of disabled veterans; repealing 72 O.S. 2011, Sections 241, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 297, 15 O.S.L. 2013 and 242 (72 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 241), which relate to the creation of the State 16 Accrediting Agency; providing for codification; providing for noncodification; providing an effective 17 date; and declaring an emergency. 18 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 20 SECTION 1. A new section of law to be codified 21 NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 241-A of Title 72, unless there 22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 23

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A. The State Accrediting Agency is hereby consolidated with the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs. Any reference in Oklahoma Statutes or in Article XXVIII of the Oklahoma Constitution to the State Accrediting Agency shall be deemed to be a reference to the Oklahoma Bureau of Alcohol and Drug Enforcement unless otherwise required by the context of the reference.

- B. All assets, funds, liabilities, allotments, purchase orders, outstanding financial obligations, encumbrances, records, equipment and other property of the State Accrediting Agency are hereby transferred to the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs.
- C. Personnel employed by the State Accrediting Agency on July
 1, 2017, shall be transferred to the Oklahoma Department of Veterans
 Affairs.
 - D. The classified and unclassified employees who are transferred pursuant to this section shall be subject to the following provisions:
 - 1. Classified employees shall remain subject to the provisions of the Merit System of Personnel Administration, as provided in the Oklahoma Personnel Act;
- 2. Unclassified employees transferred to the Oklahoma

 2. Department of Veterans Affairs shall remain in the unclassified service and shall serve at the pleasure of the Director of the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs;

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3. All employees who are transferred pursuant to this act shall retain leave, sick and annual time earned and any retirement and longevity benefits which have accrued during their employment with the state. The salaries of employees who are transferred shall not be reduced as a direct and immediate result of the transfer; and

- 4. If the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs should implement a reduction in force, all employees transferred pursuant to this act shall be credited for the time they were employed by the State Accrediting Agency.
- 10 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 11 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
 - The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs shall serve as transition coordinator and shall establish a transition team to coordinate the orderly transfer of duties, personnel, property, funds and encumbrances from and consolidation of the State Accrediting Agency to the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs.
- SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 72 O.S. 2011, Section 63.8, as
 amended by Section 6, Chapter 212, O.S.L. 2014 (72 O.S. Supp. 2016,
 Section 63.8), is amended to read as follows:
 - Section 63.8. The Oklahoma Veterans Commission shall have the authority to administer the affairs of the Department of Veterans Affairs, and to enter into agreements with the State Department of Rehabilitation Services for the vocational rehabilitation of

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    disabled veterans in the Oklahoma State Veterans Centers. The
    Commission shall act as the funding agency for the State Accrediting
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    Agency and provide office space for the staff of the agency. The
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    State Accrediting Agency shall pay to the Commission their pro rata
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    share of utilities and telephone service.
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        SECTION 4.
                       REPEALER 72 O.S. 2011, Sections 241, as
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    amended by Section 1, Chapter 297, O.S.L. 2013 (72 O.S. Supp. 2016,
    Section 241) and 242 are hereby repealed.
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        SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
        SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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    of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
