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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-116.4 of Title 70, unless
18	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. The board of education of each school district shall adopt a
20	policy on or before December 1, 2017, that permits the self-
21	administration of cannabidiol, as defined by Section 2-101 of Title
22	63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, by a student for treatment of epilepsy
23	pursuant to Section 2-802 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The
24	policy shall require:

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1. The parent or legal guardian of the student to authorize in writing the student's self-administration of cannabidiol;

- 2. The parent or legal guardian of the student to provide to the school a written statement from the physician treating the student that the student has epilepsy and is capable of, and has been instructed in the proper method of, self-administration of cannabidiol;
- 3. The parent or legal guardian of the student to provide to the school an emergency supply of the student's cannabidiol to be administered pursuant to the provisions of Section 1-116.2 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 4. The school district to inform the parent or legal guardian of the student, in writing, that the school district and its employees and agents shall incur no liability as a result of any injury arising from the self-administration of cannabidiol by the student; and
- 5. The parent or legal guardian of the student to sign a statement acknowledging that the school district shall incur no liability as a result of any injury arising from the self-administration of cannabidiol by the student.
- B. As used in this section, "self-administration" means a student's use of cannabidiol pursuant to a prescription or written direction from a physician.

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- C. The permission for self-administration of cannabidiol is effective for the school year for which it is granted and shall be renewed each subsequent school year upon fulfillment of the requirements of this section.
- D. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Board of Health, shall develop a model policy which school districts may use in compliance with this section.
- E. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Board of Health, shall promulgate rules to implement this section.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
