The salary increase provided for in this section shall be in addition to, and 13 not as a replacement for, the step increase indicated for the 14 15 certified employee pursuant to the State Minimum Salary Schedule, as provided in Section 18-114.14 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, 16 17 and shall not be contingent upon school district adoption of or participation in a merit-based or incentive pay plan for certified 18 personnel. The State Department of Education shall disburse these 19 monies to local school districts on a monthly basis beginning 20 September 1, 2020. To determine the amount of the initial 21 disbursements for each school district, the State Board of Education 22 shall use the data of the number of certified teachers as reported 23 in the final Oklahoma Annual Certified Personnel Report for FY 2020. 24
