7 An Act relating to driver licenses; providing for
8 revocation for certain malicious offenses; providing
9 period of revocation; providing for codification; and
10 providing an effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-205.3 of Title 47, unless
14 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 A. The Department of Public Safety shall immediately revoke the
16 driving privilege of any person under the age of twenty-one (21)
17 years of age upon receiving a record of the person's conviction in
18 any municipal, state or federal court within the United States of
19 any of the following offenses, when such conviction has become
20 final:

21 1. Malicious use of an explosive or incendiary device to damage
22 property;

23 2. Conspiracy to injure or damage by use of an explosive or
24 incendiary device;

1 3. Making a false report concerning a destructive device in a
2 public building;

3 4. Perpetrating a hoax concerning a destructive device in a
4 public building;

5 5. Possessing or carrying a dynamite cartridge, bomb, grenade,
6 mine or powerful explosive on educational property; or

7 6. Causing, encouraging or aiding a minor to possess or carry a
8 dynamite cartridge, bomb, grenade, mine or powerful explosive on
9 educational property.

10 B. The period of revocation under this section shall be one (1)
11 year. Revocations under this section run concurrently with any
12 other revocation.

13 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.

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
