SENATE BILL 620

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to confidentiality of information;
defining terms; prohibiting making certain
information available on the internet under certain
circumstances; creating misdemeanor offense;
providing for codification; and providing an
effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 839.4 of Title 21, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. As used in this section:

1. "Immediate family" means a law enforcement official's
spouse, child, or parent or any other blood relative who lives in
the same residence as the law enforcement official;

2. "Law enforcement official" means any duly appointed person
charged with the responsibility of maintaining public order, safety
and health by the enforcement of laws, ordinances or orders of this
state or any of its political subdivisions and who is authorized to
bear arms in execution of his or her responsibilities, including

1 reserve force deputies, reserve municipal police officers and tribal
2 law enforcement officers who are commissioned pursuant to a cross-
3 deputization agreement authorized by Section 1221 of Title 74 of the
4 Oklahoma Statutes; and

5 3. "Personal information" means the home address, home
6 telephone number, personal mobile telephone number, pager number,
7 personal e-mail address or a personal photograph of a law
8 enforcement official, or directions to the home of a law enforcement
9 official or photographs of the home or vehicle of a law enforcement
10 official.

11 B. It shall be unlawful for a person to knowingly make
12 available on the internet personal information about a law
13 enforcement official or the official's immediate family member, if
14 the dissemination of the personal information poses an imminent and
15 serious threat to the law enforcement official's safety or the
16 safety of the law enforcement official's immediate family and the
17 person making the information available on the internet knows or
18 reasonably should know of the imminent and serious threat.

19 C. A person convicted of a violation of this section shall be
20 guilty of a misdemeanor.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
