from instructional staff within five (5) school days, the governing body of the virtual charter school shall notify the student's parent or legal guardian.

- B. 1. Subject to the provisions of subsection C of this section, the third time in the same semester that a student attending a virtual charter school fails to respond appropriately to a school assignment or directive from instructional staff within five (5) school days, the governing body of the virtual charter school shall notify the student's parent or legal guardian, the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board and the State Board of Education. The governing body of the virtual charter school may transfer the student to his or her resident school district, as defined in Section 1-113 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, but it shall first notify the student's parent or legal guardian, the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board and the State Board of Education.
  - 2. The parent or legal guardian of a student transferred to his or her resident district pursuant to this subsection may appeal the transfer to the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board within thirty (30) days after receipt of the notice of transfer. The Statewide Virtual Charter School Board shall affirm the transfer decision unless the Board finds that the decision was arbitrary or unreasonable.

- C. If the parent or legal guardian of the student attending a virtual charter school notifies the virtual charter school in writing before a school assignment or directive is given that the student will not be available to respond to the assignment or directive during a specific period of time, the school days during that period shall not count for purposes of subsection B of this section. The virtual charter school shall require the student to complete any assignment missed during the period. This subsection shall apply to no more than ten (10) school days in a school year.
- D. The Statewide Virtual Charter School Board shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section.
  - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
