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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 5010, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 5010. A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall
16	analyze the state-purchased and state-subsidized health care
17	programs and explore options for cost containment and delivery
18	alternatives for those programs that are consistent with the
19	purposes of those programs, including, but not limited to:
20	1. Creation of economic incentives for the persons for whom the
21	state purchases or subsidizes health care to appropriately utilize
22	and purchase health care services, including the development of
23	flexible benefit plans to offset increases in individual financial
24	responsibility:

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2. Utilization of provider arrangements that encourage cost containment and ensure access to quality care, including, but not limited to, prepaid delivery systems, utilization review, and prospective payment methods;

- Coordination of state agency efforts to purchase drugs effectively;
- 4. Development of recommendations and methods for purchasing medical equipment and supporting services on a volume discount basis; and
- 5. Development of data systems to obtain utilization data from state-purchased and state-subsidized health care programs in order to identify cost centers, utilization patterns, provider and hospital practice patterns, and procedure costs; and
- 6. Methods to reduce payments to out-of-state providers in bordering states when in-state providers are available and feasible for the delivery of health care services.
- B. 1. The Authority shall prepare for the Governor, the Legislature and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee for the Oklahoma Health Care Authority President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Governor an annual report on the savings realized and all costs incurred in the implementation of any drug and health care services cost containment programs including, but not limited to:

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1	a. development and implementation of a drug prior
2	authorization list, and
3	b. other uses of prior authorizations.
4	2. Costs shall include direct costs such as staffing, contracts
5	and other resources used.
6	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
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
