Where the state has passed a general statute regulating a subject, a county shall restrict its jurisdiction and the passage of its ordinances, resolutions, rules, and regulations to and in conformity with the state statute on the same subject, unless the county is otherwise expressly authorized by statute.
- B. Unless expressly authorized by state statute, a county shall not implement an ordinance, resolution, rule, or regulation that conflicts with or is more stringent than a state statute regardless of when the statute takes effect.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3120 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Where the state has passed a general statute regulating a subject, a political subdivision, as defined by Section 152 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes, shall restrict its jurisdiction and the passage of its ordinances, resolutions, rules, policies and regulations to and in conformity with the state statute on the same subject, unless the political subdivision is otherwise expressly authorized by statute.
