16	1. "Alert" means the statewide silver alert for missing senior

20	or city, or the state highway patrol;
21	3. "Media outlet" includes but is not limited to radio
22	stations, television stations, newspapers and local support

1 "Missing senior citizen or distressed individual" means a 2 person: 3 whose whereabouts are unknown, a. whose age at the time the person is first reported 4 b. 5 missing is sixty (60) years of age or older and who is believed to be suffering from dementia or other 6 7 cognitive impairment, and whose disappearance poses a credible threat to the 8 C. 9 safety and health of the person, as determined by a 10 local law enforcement agency, or 11 d. whose current mental health status prohibits them from 12 reasonable and prudent judgment. 13 SECTION 2. 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1990.3, is AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 14 Section 1-1990.3. The Department of Public Safety shall develop 15 and implement a statewide silver alert system to be activated on 16 17 behalf of a missing senior citizen or distressed individual in cooperation with the Department of Transportation, the Department of 18 Human Services, any local law enforcement agency, the Oklahoma 19 Association of Broadcasters and any other appropriate state or local 20 agencies. 21 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1990.4, is SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 22 amended to read as follows:

Section 1-1990.4. The Commissioner of Public Safety is the statewide coordinator of the silver alert system and shall:

1. Adopt rules and issue directives as necessary to ensure

- 1. Adopt rules and issue directives as necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert. The rules and directives shall include:
  - a. the procedures to be used by a local law enforcement agency to verify whether a senior citizen or an individual:
    - (1) is missing,

- (2) is believed to be suffering from dementia or other cognitive impairment, and
- (3) is one whose disappearance is believed to pose a credible risk to the health and safety of the missing person, or
- (4) is currently undergoing a mental health crisis,
- b. the criteria for local law enforcement agencies to consider in circumstances in which a missing person may not meet the age requirements of a silver alert but whose safety would be best protected by the issuance of a silver alert,
- c. the procedures for local law enforcement agencies to follow in initiating a statewide silver alert,
- d. the method whereby information is distributed to statewide media outlets,

1	e. the procedures for the receipt and evaluation of
2	information received from the public about the missing
3	senior citizen <u>or individual</u> , and
4	f. the procedure for the termination of a silver alert;

6	2. Coordinate with local and statewide media outlets for the

8	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
