L5	January 15, 1929. An American Baptist minister and activist, he
16	became the most visible spokesperson and leader in the civil rights
L7	movement from 1954 through 1968; and
L8	WHEREAS, during his short life, Martin Luther King, Jr. offered
L9	courageous, eloquent and inspiring leadership that transformed the
20	United States and encouraged people around the world; and
21	WHEREAS, as the pastor of the Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in
22	Montgomery, Alabama, Dr. King led the bus boycott of 1955 that led
23	to an end of bus segregation. In 1957, he became the first
ЭΔ	president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, where he
