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L7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 421 of Title 72, unless there is
20	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs shall create and
22	maintain a registry of all veterans in this state. The registry
23	shall include the following information regarding the veteran:
24	1. Name;

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- 1 2. Military ranking and branch of service;
  - 3. Dates of service; and

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- 4. Date of death and place of burial, if applicable.
- B. The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs shall promulgate rules for implementing the provisions of this section.
- C. For purposes of this section, "veteran" means a person who served on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States who was discharged or released with an honorable discharge.

- Section 6-124. As a way to honor and recognize the veterans

- 14 make space available in the upper left hand corner of the front of

- 16 | the word "veteran" to be designed by the Department that will serve
- 17 as a notation of veteran status. Upon
- 18 B. Prior to January 1, 2018, upon application for issuance or
- 19 renewal of the driver license or identification card and in addition
- 20 to other documentation required by the Department, persons
- 21 requesting the flag emblem shall show proof of present or past
- 22 | military service by presenting:
- 1. A valid Uniformed Services Identity Card;

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2. A United States Department of Defense Form (DD)214, (DD)215 or a World War II discharge document WD AGO Form or NavPers Form that shows a discharge status of "honorable" or "general under honorable conditions";

- 3. An Oklahoma Army or Air National Guard NGB Form 22;
- 4. A United States Department of Veterans Affairs photo identification card; or

- 5. A United States Uniformed Services DD Form 2 (Retired or Reserve Retired) Identification Card.
- C. Beginning January 1, 2018, except as otherwise provided in this subsection, upon application for issuance or renewal of the driver license or identification card, the Department of Public Safety employee shall confirm the person requesting the flag emblem has registered with the veterans' registry created by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs pursuant to Section 1 of this act.

  Provided, that if the person requesting the flag emblem has been previously identified as a veteran by the Department of Public Safety, no further verification of status shall be required to receive the flag emblem. The Department of Public Safety may adopt and promulgate rules governing the use of the registry for determination of eligibility for the issuance of the flag emblem.

  SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.

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
