A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7-207 of Title 70, unless there 18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 19 By December 1, 2017, all school districts in this state 20 shall submit a report to the State Department of Education which 21 identifies any possible cost-sharing administrative co-ops that 22 could be implanted with their neighboring school districts.

the report may identify any potential savings, at a minimum, the

report shall identify potential savings through the use of

administrative co-ops or other cost-sharing agreements in the areas of personnel, licensing, professional and overhead/transportation costs through an administrative unification of multiple districts.

- B. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any school to be closed or for any school district to be dissolved or be required to consolidate.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7-208 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to create rewards for school districts that implement administrative co-op plans. This program shall be known and may be cited as the "School Administrative Costs Co-op Rewards Program Act of 2017".
- B. The State Department of Education shall implement a procedure to verify savings reported by school districts.
- C. Seventy-five percent (75%) of the total amount of saved funds shall be made available for pay increases for teachers and other school personnel at the schools participating in the School Administrative Costs Co-op Rewards Program Act of 2017. Such funds shall pass outside the state funding formula and shall not be deducted in any way from appropriations the school district would have otherwise received.
- D. If a school district has already implemented a similar co-op agreement among multiple communities or school systems, it may apply
