12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-103.1 of Title 26, unless
15	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	A. Beginning with the 2018 election cycle, elections for the
17	office of county sheriff shall be conducted on a nonpartisan basis.
18	Candidates for county sheriff shall file a Declaration of Candidacy
19	with the secretary of the county election board as provided in
20	Section 5-103 of Title 26 of the Oklahoma Statutes but shall not
21	declare a party affiliation.
22	B. If more than two candidates qualify to have their names
23	appear on the ballot for the office of county sheriff, the names of
24	all such candidates shall appear on the Primary Election ballot. If

no single candidate receives more than fifty percent (50%) of the votes cast at the Primary Election, the names of the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes at the Primary Election shall appear on the General Election ballot.

- C. If only two candidates qualify to have their names appear on the ballot for the office of county sheriff, the names of both candidates shall appear on the General Election ballot.
- SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 510, is amended to read as follows:

Section 510. Any person_{τ} otherwise qualified_{τ} who has been a resident of the State of Oklahoma for two (2) years, has been a registered voter of the party whose nomination he or she seeks, or a registered Independent, and resides within the county from which such person seeks election for the six (6) months next preceding the first day of the filing period, except in 2004, when such person must have been a qualified registered elector no later than December 21, 2003, is at least twenty-five (25) years of age next preceding the date of filing for office, and possesses at least a high school education, shall be eligible to hold the office of county sheriff or to file therefor. Provided, however, in counties with populations of five hundred thousand (500,000) or more, the person seeking election shall also be a current certified peace officer in good standing. Within twelve (12) months of taking office, all newly elected or appointed sheriffs shall complete a sheriff's

    to complete the sheriff's administrative school within the specified
