6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to agriculture; creating the Farmers
8 Market Liability Limitation Act; providing
9 definitions; stating that farmers market participant
10 assume an inherent risk; providing a defense of
11 assumption of risk; specifying liability limitation
12 is in addition to other limitations; providing
13 liability limitation shall not exist under certain
14 circumstances; providing for codification; and
15 providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-18 of Title 2, unless there is
19 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Farmers Market
21 Liability Limitation Act".

22 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-19 of Title 2, unless there is
24 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in the Farmers Market Liability Limitation Act:

1 1. "Farmers market" means a market that is registered with the
2 Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry;

3 2. "Farmers market operator" means the person who promotes or
4 manages the activities at a farmers market registered with the
5 Department;

6 3. "Participant" means any person who attends a farmers market
7 or who sells, purchases or consumes any products offered or sold at
8 a farmers market.

9 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-20 of Title 2, unless there is
11 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 A. Any participant assumes the inherent risk of attending,
13 buying or selling goods at a farmers market registered with the
14 Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry. If a
15 participant brings an action for damages arising from the operation
16 of a registered farmers market, the registered farmers market
17 operator may plead an affirmative defense of assumption of risk by
18 the participant.

19 B. Any limitation on legal liability afforded to a registered
20 farmers market operator by this act shall be in addition to any
21 other limitation of legal liability otherwise provided by law.

22 C. Nothing in this act shall prevent or limit the liability of
23 a registered farmers market operator if:
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1 1. The registered farmers market operator injures the
2 participant by intentional or willful misconduct; or

3 2. The registered farmers market operator has actual knowledge
4 of a dangerous condition in the land, facilities or equipment used
5 in the registered farmers market activity or the dangerous
6 propensity of a particular animal used in such activity and does not
7 make the dangerous condition known to the participant, and the
8 dangerous condition causes the participant to sustain injuries or
9 death.

10 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
