HOUSE BILL 1836

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to agriculture; transferring law enforcement powers, duties, responsibilities and personnel from the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission to the State Board of Agriculture; allowing transferred personnel to maintain certain employment positions and benefits; transferring functions and powers to State Board of Agriculture; amending 3A O.S. 2011, Section 203.3, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 380, O.S.L. 2014 (3A O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 203.3), which relates to powers of the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission; deleting law enforcement language from Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission; amending 2 O.S. 2011, Section 2-4, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 20, O.S.L. 2015 (2 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 2-4), which relates to the powers of the State Board of Agriculture; providing for law enforcement division for horse racing; granting powers to investigate and prevent crime in the state; requiring Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to provide information as requested; allowing Board to review and remedy security at race tracks; providing for no restriction on other law enforcement agencies; authorizing purchase of vehicles, supplies and uniforms; amending 3A O.S. 2011, Section 204.2, which relates to licensing and fees; transferring funds from fees received; specifying funds shall be received in Agriculture Evidence and Law Enforcement Fund; amending 2 O.S. 2011, Section 2-27.1, which relates to the Agriculture Evidence and Law Enforcement Fund; increasing the maximum balance of the fund; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-32 of Title 2, unless there is
4 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

5 A. The law enforcement division of the Oklahoma Horse Racing
6 Commission is hereby transferred to the State Board of Agriculture.
7 The power, duties and responsibilities exercised by the law
8 enforcement division of the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission in
9 Sections 200 through 209 in Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes are
10 granted to the State Board of Agriculture.

11 B. Personnel transferred pursuant to the provisions of this
12 section shall not be required to accept a lesser salary than
13 presently received; provided, the provisions of this section shall
14 not operate to prohibit the imposition of furloughs or reductions-
15 in-force with respect to such personnel as allowed by law.
16 Personnel transferred shall be placed within the classification
17 level in which they meet qualifications without an entrance exam.
18 All such persons shall retain seniority, leave, sick and annual time
19 earned and any retirement benefits which have accrued during their
20 tenure with their respective agency. The transfer of personnel
21 among the agencies shall be coordinated with the Office of
22 Management and Enterprise Services.

23 C. All rules, regulations, acts, orders, determinations and
24 decisions of the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission pertaining to the

1 functions and powers herein transferred and assigned to the Oklahoma
2 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry in force at the time
3 of such transfer, assignment, assumption or devolution shall
4 continue in force and effect as rules, regulations, acts, orders,
5 determinations and decisions of the Oklahoma Department of
6 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry until modified or abrogated by the
7 Cabinet or until otherwise provided by law. From and after the
8 originating agency's date of official transfer to the Oklahoma
9 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, any amendment, repeal
10 or addition to the transferred rules shall be under the jurisdiction
11 of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry. All
12 documents issued by the sections transferred to the Oklahoma
13 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, including, but not
14 limited to, vehicle registrations and permits, shall be deemed to
15 have been issued by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food,
16 and Forestry. The Office of Administrative Rules in the Secretary
17 of State's office shall provide adequate notice in "The Oklahoma
18 Register" of the transfer of rules, and shall place the transferred
19 rules under the Administrative Code section of the Oklahoma
20 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry.

21 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2011, Section 203.3, as
22 amended by Section 1, Chapter 380, O.S.L. 2014 (3A O.S. Supp. 2016,
23 Section 203.3), is amended to read as follows:
24

1 Section 203.3 A. The Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission shall
2 appoint an executive director who shall have the same qualifications
3 as a member of the Commission. The qualification regarding the
4 residency requirement for Commission members shall not apply to the
5 executive director. The executive director shall have experience in
6 the horse racing industry of a character and for a length of time
7 sufficient, in the opinion of the Commission, to fulfill the duties
8 required of the executive director. The Commission shall determine
9 the duties and compensation of the executive director.

10 B. The executive director shall recommend to the Commission the
11 administrative organization and the number and qualifications of
12 employees necessary without regard to race, color, gender, creed or
13 national origin, to implement the provisions of the Oklahoma Horse
14 Racing Act. A written equal opportunity plan will be developed for
15 the Commission, by the executive director as part of the
16 organizational plan. Upon approval of the organizational plan by
17 the Commission, the executive director may employ such persons as
18 are deemed necessary to implement the provisions of the Oklahoma
19 Horse Racing Act.

20 C. ~~1. The organizational plan adopted by the Commission shall~~
21 ~~provide for a law enforcement division which shall have the~~
22 ~~responsibility for conducting investigations relating to the proper~~
23 ~~conduct of horse racing and the pari-mutuel system of wagering~~
24 ~~including but not limited to barring undesirables from horse racing,~~

1 ~~undercover investigations, fingerprinting persons licensed by the~~
2 ~~Commission, and reviewing license applications. The person in~~
3 ~~charge of the law enforcement division shall be a professional law~~
4 ~~enforcement officer with a minimum of five (5) years of experience~~
5 ~~in the field of law enforcement and a graduate of a four-year~~
6 ~~college with a degree in law enforcement administration, law,~~
7 ~~criminology or a related science, or in lieu thereof a minimum of~~
8 ~~ten (10) years of experience in the field of law enforcement.~~

9 ~~2. The officers and agents of the law enforcement division of~~
10 ~~the Commission, and such other employees as the person in charge of~~
11 ~~said division shall designate to perform duties in the investigation~~
12 ~~and prevention of crime and the enforcement of the criminal laws of~~
13 ~~the state, shall have and exercise all the powers and authority of~~
14 ~~peace officers, including the right and power of search and seizure.~~

15 ~~3. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall provide~~
16 ~~such information within its possession as is requested by the law~~
17 ~~enforcement division of the Commission for the purpose of reviewing~~
18 ~~license applications.~~

19 ~~4. If upon investigation by the Commission there is substantial~~
20 ~~evidence indicating that the security at any track is not~~
21 ~~satisfactory, the Commission may order the organization licensee to~~
22 ~~remedy the deficiency. If after ten (10) days following the order~~
23 ~~the organization licensee has not remedied the deficiency, the~~
24 ~~Commission may institute its own security personnel program until~~

1 ~~the deficiency in security is remedied, and may charge the~~
2 ~~organization licensee the actual costs incurred for said security.~~
3 ~~The organization licensee may petition the Commission for a hearing~~
4 ~~at any time to review the necessity of the Commission further~~
5 ~~maintaining its own security personnel.~~

6 ~~5. The provisions of this subsection shall not be construed to~~
7 ~~restrict or prohibit any federal, state, or local law enforcement~~
8 ~~officer from performing any duties imposed upon the law enforcement~~
9 ~~officer by law.~~

10 ~~6. The executive director is authorized to purchase and~~
11 ~~maintain motor vehicles, to authorize the purchase and issuance of~~
12 ~~uniforms for all law enforcement officers within the law enforcement~~
13 ~~division of the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission and to purchase and~~
14 ~~issue necessary equipment for all employees of the Commission. All~~
15 ~~uniforms and equipment shall be used only in the performance of the~~
16 ~~official duties of the law enforcement officers and other personnel~~
17 ~~of the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission as designated by the~~
18 ~~executive director and shall remain the property of the Oklahoma~~
19 ~~Horse Racing Commission.~~

20 ~~D.~~ The executive director shall obtain a surety bond in the
21 amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) before entering
22 into the duties of the office. The surety bond shall be conditioned
23 upon the faithful performance of the duties of the executive
24 director and the proper accounting of all moneys and property

1 received by the executive director by virtue of the office. The
2 cost of the surety bond shall be paid by the Commission.

3 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 2-4, as last
4 amended by Section 1, Chapter 20, O.S.L. 2015 (2 O.S. Supp. 2016,
5 Section 2-4), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 2-4. A. The State Board of Agriculture shall have the
7 power to:

8 1. Adopt and prescribe the use of a seal, which shall be in the
9 custody of the Secretary of the Board;

10 2. Promulgate rules necessary, expedient, or appropriate to the
11 performance, enforcement, or carrying out of any of the purposes,
12 objectives, or provisions of the Oklahoma Agricultural Code;

13 3. Initiate and prosecute administrative, civil, or criminal
14 actions and proceedings necessary under the Oklahoma Agricultural
15 Code;

16 4. Appoint authorized agents to make inspections or
17 investigations and to perform other services for the Board or any
18 division of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and
19 Forestry;

20 5. Consolidate any of the divisions established by the Oklahoma
21 Agricultural Code, transfer any of the functions or activities to
22 another division, place additional functions or activities in a
23 division, establish new divisions, and create new or additional
24

positions in the Department, when conducive to a more efficient administration and enforcement of laws pertaining to agriculture;

6. Sell, exchange, or dispose of property;

7. Have jurisdiction over all matters affecting animal industry, animal health, and animal quarantine;

8. Issue stop-sale and stop-use orders and quarantines;

9. Employ, appoint, or contract and fix the duties and compensation of the director of each division of the Department and other personnel, either on a full-time, part-time, or contractual basis, as deemed necessary by the Board;

10. Fix the qualifications of the personnel in the Department;

11. Accept and use grants of money and other property from any source;

12. Advise, consult, cooperate, and enter into agreements or contracts with persons as defined in the Oklahoma Agricultural Code;

13. Coordinate with the federal government and other states on matters pertaining to agriculture;

14. Revoke, suspend, or deny for up to one (1) year, any license, permit, or charter issued by the Board if the Board finds any violations of the Oklahoma Agricultural Code or any rule of the Board;

15. Adopt a master plan and promulgate rules for the protection of state-owned and private forestry, grazing, and other lands from damage by fire and for suppressing fires on lands. In carrying out

1 the master plan the Board is authorized to enter into contractual
2 agreements with the federal government, local political subdivisions
3 of the state, individuals, private organizations, companies, and
4 corporations for protection and for the suppression of fires and to
5 expend funds as available for these services. To effectuate the
6 purposes of the Oklahoma Agricultural Code, the Board is authorized
7 to enter into contractual agreements with private landowners for the
8 protection and suppression of fires, provided that the private
9 landowners reimburse the Board for actual expenses incurred in the
10 protection and suppression of fires on privately owned lands;

11 16. Have jurisdiction over all matters affecting agriculture as
12 contained and set out in the Oklahoma Agricultural Code, which have
13 not been expressly delegated to another state or federal agency and
14 be responsible for fully implementing and enforcing the laws and
15 rules within its jurisdictional areas of environmental
16 responsibility.

17 a. The Department of Environmental Quality shall have
18 environmental jurisdiction over:

19 (1) commercial manufacturers of fertilizers, grain
20 and feed products, and chemicals, and over
21 manufacturing of food and kindred products,
22 tobacco, paper, lumber, wood, textile mill, and
23 other agricultural products,
24

1 (2) slaughterhouses, but not including feedlots at
2 these facilities, and

3 (3) aquaculture and fish hatcheries, including, but
4 not limited to, discharges of pollutants and
5 storm water to waters of the state, surface
6 impoundments and land application of wastes and
7 sludge, and other pollution originating at these
8 facilities.

9 b. Facilities storing grain, feed, seed, fertilizer, and
10 agricultural chemicals that are required by federal
11 National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System
12 (NPDES) regulations to obtain a permit for storm water
13 discharges shall only be subject to the jurisdiction
14 of the Department of Environmental Quality with
15 respect to storm water discharges;

16 17. Have jurisdiction over all matters affecting the
17 importation, health, and quarantining of exotic livestock;

18 18. Prescribe forms of application, certification, licenses,
19 charters, and other forms and blanks as may be necessary to carry
20 out the provisions of the Oklahoma Agricultural Code;

21 19. Stagger throughout the year the renewal dates for any
22 licenses or permits issued by the Department pursuant to the
23 provisions of the Oklahoma Agricultural Code by notifying licensees
24 in writing of the expiration and renewal date being assigned to the

1 licensee and permittee and by making an appropriate adjustment in
2 the fee charged for the license or permit;

3 20. Establish and collect fees for licenses, permits, charters,
4 and services provided. The fees shall be promulgated in accordance
5 with the Administrative Procedures Act and shall be fair and
6 equitable to all parties concerned;

7 21. Establish planting and harvesting seasons for the purpose
8 of meeting the maximum driving and on-duty time exemptions set forth
9 in the National Highway System Designation Act of 1995. The Board
10 shall notify the United States Secretary of Transportation of the
11 seasons;

12 22. Fix and adopt official standards for grading and
13 classifying any agricultural commodity, meat, or meat product
14 prepared, produced, or distributed in Oklahoma;

15 23. Promulgate rules, make investigations, and conduct hearings
16 for the purpose of making inspection compulsory on any agricultural
17 commodity and designate the shipping points where compulsory
18 inspection applies;

19 24. Inspect agricultural commodities, at any time, upon request
20 of any financially interested party or when necessary and to issue
21 certificates showing the quality and condition of the commodities at
22 the time of the inspection;

23 25. Grade meat or meat products upon the request of any packing
24 plant in Oklahoma. The packing plant shall be required to pay the

1 cost of services, including the compensation and expenses of
2 personnel employed to perform the actual grading;

3 26. Apply to the district court for a temporary or permanent
4 injunction or any other remedy restraining any person from violating
5 the Oklahoma Agricultural Code;

6 27. Extend and implement the powers and provisions granted by
7 the Oklahoma Agricultural Code to all programs administered by the
8 Department regardless of whether the statutes creating the program
9 are codified in this title;

10 28. Increase its efforts to ensure the safety and quality of
11 food and food products for wholesalers and retail sales in this
12 state and shall include, but not be limited to, inspections of
13 retailers and wholesalers to ensure compliance with all federal and
14 state certification standards;

15 29. Exercise all incidental powers which are necessary and
16 proper to implement and administer the purposes of the Oklahoma
17 Agricultural Code;

18 30. Accept upon behalf of the Department any gift or donation
19 of property, including but not limited to monetary gifts;

20 31. Promulgate rules regarding prescribed burning and smoke
21 management;

22 32. Enter into written leases or lease-purchase agreements to
23 acquire equipment, furnishings, supplies and other items necessary
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1 for the operation of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food,
2 and Forestry Agriculture Laboratory;

3 33. Exercise all incidental powers and promulgate rules,
4 procedures and forms which are necessary and proper to implement,
5 administer and enforce the Oklahoma Scrap Metal Dealers Act;

6 34. Promulgate rules to ensure state control of any federal
7 program relating to on-farm fruit and vegetable production
8 inspections and regulation; ~~and~~

9 35. Develop a pollinator protection plan to promote the health
10 of and mitigate the risks to honeybees and other managed
11 pollinators; and

12 36. Provide for a law enforcement division which shall have the
13 responsibility for conducting investigations relating to the proper
14 conduct of horse racing and the pari-mutuel system of wagering
15 including but not limited to barring undesirables from horse racing,
16 undercover investigations, fingerprinting persons licensed by the
17 Commission and reviewing license applications. The person in charge
18 of the law enforcement division shall be a professional law
19 enforcement officer with a minimum of five (5) years of experience
20 in the field of law enforcement and a graduate of a four-year
21 college with a degree in law enforcement administration, law,
22 criminology or a related science, or in lieu thereof a minimum of
23 ten (10) years of experience in the field of law enforcement.

3 d. The provisions of this subsection shall not be
4 construed to restrict or prohibit any federal, state
5 or local law enforcement officer from performing any
6 duties imposed upon the law enforcement officer by
7 law.

8 e. The Commissioner of Agriculture is authorized to
9 purchase and maintain motor vehicles, to authorize the
10 purchase and issuance of uniforms for all law
11 enforcement officers within the law enforcement
12 division of the Board and to purchase and issue
13 necessary equipment. All uniforms and equipment shall
14 be used only in the performance of the official duties
15 of the law enforcement officers within the law
16 enforcement division of the Board as designated by the
17 Commissioner of Agriculture and shall remain the
18 property of the Department of Agriculture.

19 B. 1. If upon inspection or investigation, or whenever the
20 Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry determines
21 that there are reasonable grounds to believe that any person is in
22 violation of any part of the Oklahoma Environmental Quality Code
23 which is the responsibility and jurisdiction of the Oklahoma
24 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, any rule promulgated

1 by the State Board of Agriculture, or of any order, permit,
2 certificate, registration, charter, or license issued by the Board,
3 the Department may give written notice to the alleged violator of
4 the specific violation and of the alleged violator's duty to correct
5 the violation immediately or within a set time period or both and
6 that the failure to do so shall result in administrative fines or
7 penalties.

8 2. Whenever the Department finds that an emergency exists
9 requiring immediate action to protect the public health, welfare, or
10 the environment, the President of the State Board of Agriculture may
11 without notice or hearing issue an order, effective upon issuance,
12 reciting the existence of an emergency and requiring that action be
13 taken as specified in the order to meet the emergency. Any person
14 to whom an order is directed shall comply immediately but may
15 request an administrative enforcement hearing within fifteen (15)
16 days after the order is served. The hearing shall be held by the
17 Department within ten (10) days after receipt of the request. On
18 the basis of the hearing record, the President of the Board shall
19 sustain or modify the original order.

20 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2011, Section 204.2, is
21 amended to read as follows:

22 Section 204.2 A. The Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission shall
23 issue occupation licenses to horse owners, trainers, jockeys,
24 agents, apprentices, grooms, exercise persons, veterinarians,

1 valets, blacksmiths, concessionaires, stewards, starters, timers,
2 judges, supervisors of mutuels, guards, and such other personnel
3 designated by the Commission whose work, in whole or in part, is
4 conducted upon racetrack grounds which are owned by an organization
5 licensee. The licenses shall be obtained prior to the time such
6 persons engage in their vocations upon such racetrack grounds at any
7 time during the calendar year for which the organization license has
8 been issued. No person required to be licensed pursuant to the
9 provisions of this section may participate in any capacity in any
10 race meeting without a valid license authorizing such participation.

11 B. Each application for an occupation license shall be on a
12 form prescribed and furnished by the Commission and shall include a
13 search waiver. The license shall be renewed either annually or
14 triennially beginning January 1. The application shall be
15 accompanied by a fee in an amount of not more than One Hundred
16 Dollars (\$100.00) if renewed annually or not more than Three Hundred
17 Dollars (\$300.00) if renewed triennially. Each application shall
18 contain the following information concerning the applicant:

- 19 1. Full name and address;
- 20 2. Age;
- 21 3. Whether the applicant was issued any prior occupation
22 license from this state;
- 23 4. Whether the applicant was issued any occupation license from
24 another state;

1 5. Whether an occupation license from another state is or has
2 been denied, suspended, or revoked;

3 6. Whether the applicant has been convicted of a felony in this
4 state or any other state as established by a national criminal
5 history record check as defined by Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the
6 Oklahoma Statutes; and

7 7. Such other information as required by the Commission.

8 C. The Commission may refuse an occupation license to any
9 person:

10 1. Who has been convicted of a felony; or

11 2. Who has been convicted of violating any law regarding
12 gambling or controlled dangerous substances of the United States,
13 this state, or any other state; or

14 3. Who is unqualified to perform the duties required of the
15 applicant; or

16 4. Who fails to disclose or states falsely any information
17 required in the application; or

18 5. Who has been found guilty of a violation of any provision of
19 the Oklahoma Horse Racing Act or of the rules and regulations of the
20 Commission; or

21 6. Whose license has been suspended, revoked, or denied for
22 just cause in any other state.

23 D. The Commission may suspend or revoke any occupation license
24 or fine an occupation licensee for:

1 1. Violation of any of the provisions of the Oklahoma Horse
2 Racing Act; or

3 2. Violation of any provision of the rules or regulations of
4 the Commission; or

5 3. Any cause which, if known to the Commission, would have
6 justified the refusal of the Commission to issue the occupation
7 license; or

8 4. Any other just cause as determined by the Commission.

9 E. Except as provided for in this subsection, the license fees
10 received by the Commission pursuant to the provisions of this
11 section shall be deposited to the credit of the General Revenue Fund
12 of the State Treasury. Of the original application fee for an
13 occupation license, the amount of the fingerprinting fee shall be
14 deposited in the OSBI Revolving Fund.

15 F. Notwithstanding any other provision of the Oklahoma Horse
16 Racing Act, Section 200 et seq. of this title, licenses for
17 personnel specified in subsection A of this section whose work is
18 limited to racetrack grounds which are owned by an organization
19 licensee which only conducts non-pari-mutuel race meetings or
20 training races shall be issued pursuant to rules adopted by the
21 Commission in accordance with the American Quarter Horse Association
22 rules.

1 G. The Commission may promulgate rules to facilitate and
2 promote uniform, reciprocal occupation licensing with other
3 jurisdictions.

4 H. Nothing in the Oklahoma Horse Racing Act or rules
5 promulgated pursuant thereto shall prohibit or be construed as
6 prohibiting issuance of any occupational license solely because the
7 applicant is an organizational licensee or racetrack owner or holds
8 an interest in a race track.

9 I. The first One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars
10 (\$125,000.00) received by the Commission from the fees collected
11 from this section shall be deposited in the Agriculture Evidence and
12 Law Enforcement Fund.

13 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 2-27.1, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 2-27.1 A. There is created in the State Treasury a
16 revolving fund for the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and
17 Forestry to be designated the "Agriculture Evidence and Law
18 Enforcement Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject
19 to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of monies received
20 from the sale of confiscated property, the seizure and forfeiture of
21 confiscated monies, property, gifts, bequests, devises, or
22 contributions, public or private, including federal and state funds
23 unless otherwise provided by federal law or regulation.

1 B. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are
2 appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma
3 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, for purposes
4 including but not limited to investigation, enforcement, and
5 prosecution of cases involving administrative, civil, or criminal
6 violations of the Agricultural Code.

7 C. The balance on deposit in the Agriculture Evidence and Law
8 Enforcement Fund shall never exceed the sum of ~~One Hundred Thousand~~
9 ~~Dollars (\$100,000.00)~~ Two Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars
