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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
17	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
18	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Appropriation
19	Stabilization Act".
20	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.2, as
21	last amended by Section 2, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2016 (62 O.S. Supp.
22	2016, Section 34.2), is amended to read as follows:
23	Section 34.2 A. Agencies responsible for the collection of
24	monies deposited to the credit of the General Revenue Fund and each

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of the Special Revenue Funds shall be subject to the provisions of this act. Upon request of the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, these agencies shall provide the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services an itemized estimate of funds expected to accrue to the General Revenue Fund and each of the Special Revenue Funds for the ensuing fiscal year in the manner and form established by the Director, in accordance with the duties assigned to the State Board of Equalization in Section 23 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution. Each of these agencies shall also provide to the Director, as requested, a written explanation of the methodology and relevant assumptions used in developing the current and future revenue estimates submitted, a statement of:

1. The prior year's actual revenue collections;

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- 2. A projection of the current year's revenue collections; and
- 3. Estimated revenue collections for the ensuing fiscal year and the following two (2) fiscal years. No expenditure shall be made from any General Revenue Fund or Special Revenue Fund until such fund has been assigned to an agency by law or by the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
- B. In addition to providing the information listed above, the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall also provide to the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services a comprehensive economic report no later than two (2) weeks prior to each of the

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meetings of the State Board of Equalization pursuant to paragraphs 1 and 3 of Section 23 of Article X of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. Each report shall include a summary of recent national and state economic performance and a forecast of national and state economic performance for the current fiscal year, the ensuing fiscal year and the following two (2) fiscal years. These reports shall be considered a basis upon which the itemized revenue estimates of the Commission are developed. The report shall include an analysis of the relative accuracy of the economic forecasts on which the previous and current fiscal years' revenue estimates were based.

C. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall compute a five-year average for the amount of revenue derived from each tax or other revenue source apportioned to the General Revenue Fund. The average shall be reported using the five (5) most recent completed fiscal years prior to the delivery of information for purposes of the revenue estimate made by the State Board of Equalization at its December meeting and shall also be delivered prior to the delivery of information for purposes of the final estimate made by the State Board of Equalization at its February meeting. The State Board of Equalization shall use the information required by this subsection in making its official estimate of revenues available for appropriation by the Legislature.

 $\underline{\text{D.}}$ The Tax Commission shall also provide all estimates, explanations, statements, projections, reports and other documents

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    required by this section to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,
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    members of the Senate Appropriations and Finance Committees, the
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    Speaker of the House of Representatives and members of the House
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    Appropriations and Budget Committee at the same time that such
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    documents are provided to the Director of the Office of Management

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        SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
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        SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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    of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
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    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
