HOUSE BILL 2537

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to public health and safety;  
requiring assisted living centers to have certain  
hours of alternate sources of energy by certain date;  
requiring newly licensed assisted living centers to  
meet requirements upon licensure; and providing an  
effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1925.5 of Title 63, unless  
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Beginning July 1, 2021, an assisted living center, as  
defined in paragraph 1 of Section 1-890.2 of Title 63 of the  
Oklahoma Statutes, shall be required to have at least ninety-six  
(96) hours of alternate sources of energy sufficient to maintain  
facility temperatures through the operation of existing heat and air  
conditioning systems to protect resident health and safety and for  
the safe and sanitary storage of food, medicines and other necessary  
provisions.

1       B. Notwithstanding anything in subsection A to the contrary, an  
2 assisted living center newly licensed beginning November 1, 2018,  
3 shall be required to meet the requirements contained in subsection A  
4 upon licensure.

5       SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
