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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 4-115.2, as
15	amended by Section 2, Chapter 152, O.S.L. 2016 (26 O.S. Supp. 2017,
16	Section 4-115.2), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 4-115.2 A. The Secretary of the State Election Board
18	is authorized to promulgate rules to keep confidential the residence
19	and mailing address, upon application to do so, of individual
20	registered voters who are members of certain classes. These classes
21	shall be limited to the judiciary, district attorneys, assistant
22	district attorneys, Uniformed Services members, law enforcement
23	personnel and the immediate family of law enforcement personnel,
24	correctional officers, persons who are protected by victim's

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protection orders, the spouses and dependents of the members of such classes, and persons who are certified by the Secretary of State as participants in the Address Confidentiality Program established by Section 60.14 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Such address information shall be provided to a candidate or candidate representative or other lawful authority in anticipation or as part of a contest of candidacy or contest of an election as provided for in Title 26 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title or as part of a petition challenge as provided by law. However, no information concerning the address of a certified Address Confidentiality Program participant shall be released by election officials to any person for any purpose except under court order.
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B. As used in this section, "immediate family of law enforcement personnel" means a spouse, child by birth or adoption, stepchild, parent, grandparent, grandchild, sibling or spouse of any immediate family member.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
