A public school may combine the Healthy and Fit School Advisory Committee with its Safe School Committee, established pursuant to Section 24-100.5 of this title.

- C. Each Healthy and Fit School Advisory Committee shall study and, make recommendations and establish a local school wellness policy that will be submitted to the school principal regarding:
 - 1. Health education;

- 2. Physical education and physical activity; and
- 3. Nutrition and health guidelines pursuant to federal regulation of school meals and snacks;
 - 4. Health services; and
 - 5. Health equity.
- D. The principal shall give consideration to recommendations of the committee School districts shall integrate key findings into the district or school's long-term strategic planning, school improvement plans or district report cards.
- E. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for monitoring compliance with this section and is authorized to report a school as deficient on the accreditation report for noncompliance with the provisions of this section To ensure implementation of the school wellness policy, the school district shall develop a plan to provide training and technical assistance to schools and to address resources or pathways for health equity.
