12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 15-133 of Title 47, unless there
15	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	For the purpose of this section, "motorcycle profiling" means
17	the discriminatory use of the fact that a person rides a motorcycle
18	or wears motorcycle-related paraphernalia as a factor in deciding to
19	stop and question, take enforcement action, arrest or search a
20	person or vehicle with or without a legal basis under the United
21	States Constitution or the Oklahoma State Constitution.
22	All law enforcement agencies in this state shall be required to:
23	1. Adopt a written policy designed to condemn and prevent
24	motorcycle profiling;

1 2. Review and audit their existing procedures, practices and 2 training; 3 3. Institute training to address the issues related to 4 motorcycle profiling; and 5 4. Work with motorcycle groups in their communities to 6 appropriately address the issue of motorcycle profiling. 7 The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training shall 8 ensure that issues related to motorcycle profiling are addressed in 9 basic law enforcement training and offered in regional training for 10 in-service law enforcement officers at all levels. 11 SECTION 2.
