NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 24 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Commerce and Tourism Agency Reorganization Act of 2018".

- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5001.101 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and Tourism.
- B. After the effective date of this act, all references in the Oklahoma Statutes to either the Oklahoma Department of Commerce or the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department shall be construed to mean the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and Tourism.
- C. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce and Tourism shall be supervised by an Executive Director. The Executive Director shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Governor. The person appointed by the Governor shall have required expertise in the private sector, the public sector or both in order to perform the duties imposed upon the Executive Director and upon the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and Tourism by law.
- D. The Governor's appointee to the position of Executive
 Director shall be subject to confirmation by the Oklahoma State
 Senate.
- E. The Executive Director shall report to the Lieutenant Governor at such times and on such subjects as the Lieutenant Governor may direct.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5001.102 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- A. All of the books, records, documents and other materials which are the separate property of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department shall become the property of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and Tourism.
- B. All employees of both the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department shall become the employees of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and Tourism.
- C. All assets, whether consisting of real or personal property, tangible or intangible, which are the separate properties of either the Oklahoma Department of Commerce or the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department shall be transferred by operation of law to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and Tourism.
- D. Any and all contracts which have not been fully executed as of the effective date of this act which were the separate responsibility of either the Oklahoma Department of Commerce or the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department shall become the obligations of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and Tourism.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5001.103 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- A. There is hereby created an Advisory Board for the Oklahoma
 Department of Commerce and Tourism.
 - B. The Advisory Board shall be composed of nine (9) members to be appointed as follows:
 - 1. Three members shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Governor;

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- 2. Three members shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives;
- 3. Three members shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate.
- C. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Department of
 Commerce and Tourism shall make such reports to the Advisory Board
 as required by such Board and shall perform such other duties as the
 Board may direct which are not inconsistent with the statutory
 duties and responsibilities of the Executive Director.
- 17 SECTION 5. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2011, Sections 2201, 2202, 18 2203, 2204, 2205, 2206 and 2207, are hereby repealed.
- 19 SECTION 6. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2011, Section 5003.5, is 20 hereby repealed.
- 21 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.
- SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
