6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to labor; creating the Oklahoma
8 Department of Labor Occupational License Database;
9 requiring Department of Labor to develop specific
10 website; authorizing Department to promulgate rules;
11 providing for information to be submitted by certain
12 regulatory entities; requiring compliance with rules;
13 providing for codification; and providing an
14 effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1.2 of Title 40, unless there is
16 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. There is hereby established the "Oklahoma Department of Labor
18 Occupational License Database".

19 B. The Department of Labor shall develop and maintain an online
20 website that allows public access to all occupational licenses and
21 certifications required by the state. The site shall include
22 functionality allowing site visitors to search by each occupation
23 and view the requirements, qualifications and fees associated with
24 each occupation.

1 C. The Department of Labor shall promulgate rules by which each
2 state agency, board or commission or any other entity that regulates
3 an occupation in this state shall submit a searchable electronic
4 version of the following information related to the licensure or
5 certification of the occupation:

- 6 1. Qualifications;
- 7 2. Licenses or certifications issued;
- 8 3. Fees;
- 9 4. Examinations;
- 10 5. Continuing education;
- 11 6. Reciprocity;
- 12 7. Penalties;
- 13 8. Contact information for the regulating entity; and
- 14 9. Any other information deemed necessary by the Department of
15 Labor to carry out the provisions of this section.

16 D. Each state agency, board or commission or any other entity
17 that regulates an occupation in this state shall comply with
18 procedures promulgated pursuant to the terms of this section.

19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
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
