HOUSE BILL 3139

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 351, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 3601.2), which relates to salaries of chief executive officers; providing maximum salary amount; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 351, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 3601.2), is amended to read as follows:

Section 3601.2 A. ~~Beginning July 1, 2013, each~~ Each agency, board, commission, department or program in the executive branch of state government shall establish the salary of each of the chief executive officers for which they have appointing authority. Such salary shall be set between the minimum and maximum of the range specified in the annual compensation reports required by paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of this title, for full-time employees only; provided the maximum salary amount shall be no greater than the

1 salary of the Governor as provided by Section 250.4 of this title,
2 unless otherwise provided by the Oklahoma Constitution.

3 B. All increases require certification of the appointing
4 authority that said action can be implemented for the current fiscal
5 year and subsequent fiscal year without the need for additional
6 funding. The agency, board, commission, department or program shall
7 report increases granted under this section to the Office of
8 Management and Enterprise Services on an annual basis by August 1 of
9 each year. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
10 forward a report of such increases to the Governor, President Pro
11 Tempore of the Senate, and Speaker of the House of Representatives
12 no later than September 1 of each year.

13 C. Every three (3) years beginning with fiscal year 2013, the
14 Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall review these
15 salary ranges and report on and make recommendations on proposed
16 salary ranges in its annual compensation reports mandated by
17 paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of this title. Such recommendations
18 shall be made no later than February 1 for chief executive officers
19 in all state agencies, boards, commissions, departments or programs
20 in the executive branch of state government, including but not
21 limited to those specified in Section 3601.1 of this title.

22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
