9	Branch Reform Act of 1986; correcting internal cites; providing for the filling of certain cabinet
10	positions; providing for and modifying certain salaries; and providing an effective date.

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 10.1, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 10.1 Sections $\frac{1}{2}$ 10.1 through $\frac{1}{2}$ 10.5 of this $\frac{1}{2}$
17	shall be known and may be cited as the "Executive Branch Reform Act
18	of 1986".
19	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 10.3, as
20	amended by Section 1, Chapter 127, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2017,
21	Section 10.3), is amended to read as follows:
22	Section 10.3 A. $1.$ Within forty-five (45) days of assuming
23	office, each Governor may create a cabinet system for the executive
24	branch of state government. The cabinet system may be an

1 organizational framework created by executive order which includes all executive agencies, boards, commissions, or institutions and 3 their assignments to specific cabinet areas. The cabinet system 4 shall consist of no more than fifteen cabinet areas and each. Each 5 cabinet area shall consist of executive agencies, boards, 6 commissions, or institutions with similar programmatic or 7 administrative objectives that shall report directly to the cabinet 8 Secretary responsible for that cabinet area. One cabinet area shall consist of the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs, its 10 institutions and other executive agencies, boards, commissions and 11 institutions which are related to veterans. The Governor's cabinet 12 shall be in effect until the Legislature supersedes each specific 13 cabinet area or department by providing by law for specific cabinet 14 areas or departments, or removes by law the authority of the 15 Governor to create a cabinet area. The Governor may appoint the 16 Lieutenant Governor as a cabinet Secretary serving in a role to be 17 determined by the Governor.

2. If a Constitutional amendment is approved by a vote of the people making the offices of State Treasurer, Superintendent of

Public Instruction, Commissioner of Labor and Insurance Commissioner appointed offices beginning on a specified date, then beginning on that date:

<u>a.</u> <u>if the cabinet system includes a Secretary whose</u> cabinet area oversees state financial or budgetary

matters, that office shall be filled by the State

Treasurer,

b. if the cabinet system includes a Secretary of

- b. if the cabinet system includes a Secretary of Education, that office shall be filled by the Superintendent of Public Instruction,
- c. if the cabinet system includes a Secretary of Labor, that office shall be filled by the Commissioner of Labor, and
- d. if the cabinet system includes a Secretary of Insurance, that office shall be filled by the Insurance Commissioner.
- 3. At any time during the Governor's term of office, the cabinet may be modified at the sole discretion of the Governor subject to Senate confirmation as provided by subsection B of this section.
- B. The Governor shall appoint, with the advice and consent of the Senate, a Secretary to head each cabinet area, except as provided in paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section. The Secretary appointee for the cabinet area consisting of the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs and other related veterans entities shall be an honorably discharged veteran and be eligible to receive benefits from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. A cabinet Secretary may be appointed as a position funded by the Office of the Governor from funds available to that office, or

appointed as a cabinet Secretary from among the agency heads within
the cabinet area. The cabinet Secretaries shall:

- 1. Advise the Governor of any policy changes or problems within the area they represent;
- 2. Advise the entities represented of any policy changes or problems as directed by the Governor; and
- 3. Coordinate information—gathering for the Legislature as requested.
- C. The cabinet Secretaries shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor; however, the appointment or removal of a cabinet Secretary who is also an agency head shall not otherwise affect the status of the other duties of the agency head. Whenever a Secretary position becomes vacant, the Governor shall appoint a successor within thirty (30) calendar days pursuant to the provisions of subsection B of this section. If the Legislature is not in session at the time of appointment it shall be subject to the advice and consent of the Senate upon convening of the next regular session of the Legislature.
- 19 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 10.5, is 20 amended to read as follows:
- Section 10.5 <u>A.</u> Notwithstanding other limits established by law, the following cabinet Secretaries may be annually compensated for their services, payable monthly, as follows:

1. The Secretary of Human Resources and Administration may
2 receive a maximum salary of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars
3 (\$75,000.00);

- 2. The Secretary of Agriculture may receive a maximum salary of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00);
- 3. The Secretary of Commerce and Tourism may receive a maximum salary of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00);
- 4. The Secretary of Education may receive a maximum salary of Sixty-five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000.00); provided, if the Secretary of Education is the Superintendent of Public Instruction, the Secretary shall be compensated as provided in Section 250.4 of this title;
- 5. The Secretary of Energy may receive a maximum salary of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00);
 - 6. The Secretary of Finance and Administration may receive a maximum salary of Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00);
 - 7. The Secretary of Health and the Secretary of Human Services may receive a maximum salary of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00);
 - 8. The Secretary of Safety and Security may receive a maximum salary of Eighty-five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000.00);
- 9. The Secretary of State may receive a maximum salary of
 Sixty-five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000.00). However, if the Secretary
 of State is designated as a cabinet Secretary, the salary of the

        10. The Secretary of Veterans Affairs may receive a maximum
 5
    salary of Sixty-five Thousand Dollars ($65,000.00);

        11. If the State Treasurer becomes a cabinet Secretary, the

    Treasurer shall be compensated as provided in Section 250.4 of this

        12. If the Commissioner of Labor becomes a cabinet Secretary,

    the Commissioner shall be compensated as provided in Section 250.4

        B. If additional cabinet Secretaries are appointed, as allowed
