L 4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L5	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1031, is
L6	amended to read as follows:
L7	Section 1031. A. Except as provided in subsection B or, D
18	or E of this section, any person violating any of the provisions of
L9	Section 1028, paragraph 1, 3 or 4 of subsection A of Section 1029 or
20	1030 of this title shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a
21	misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished punishable by
22	imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days
23	nor more than one (1) year or by fines as follows: a fine of not
24	more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2.500.00) upon the

first conviction for violation of any of such provisions, a fine of not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) upon the second conviction for violation of any of such provisions, and a fine of not more than Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) upon the third or subsequent convictions for violation of any of such provisions, or by both such imprisonment and fine. In addition, the court may require a term of community service of not less than forty (40) nor more than eighty (80) hours. The court in which any such conviction is had shall notify the county superintendent of public health of such conviction.

- B. Any person who engages in an act of prostitution with knowledge that they are he or she is infected with the human immunodeficiency virus shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than five (5) years.
- C. Any person who engages in an act of child prostitution, as defined in Section 1030 of this title, shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than ten (10) years and by fines as follows: a fine of not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) upon the first conviction, a fine of not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) upon the second conviction, and a fine of not more than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) upon the third or subsequent convictions.

D. Any person violating any of the provisions of Section 1028, 1029 or 1030 of this title within one thousand (1,000) feet of a school or church shall be quilty of a felony and, upon conviction, shall be punished be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than five (5) years or by fines as follows: a fine of not more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) upon the first conviction for violation of any of such provisions, a fine of not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) upon the second conviction for violation of any of such provisions, and a fine of not more than Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) upon the third or subsequent convictions for violation of any of such provisions, or by both such imprisonment and fine. In addition, the court may require a term of community service of not less than forty (40) nor more than eighty (80) hours. The court in which any such conviction is had shall notify the county superintendent of public health of such conviction.

E. Any person violating paragraph 2 of subsection A of Section

1029 of this title shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a

misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for a term

of not less than thirty (30) days nor more than one (1) year or by a

fine of not less than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or by both

such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1081, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1081. Any person who shall procure:

- 1. Procure any other person for prostitution, or who, by;
- 2. By promise, threats, violence or by any device or scheme shall cause, induce, persuade or encourage another person to become a prostitute; or shall procure
- 3. Procure a place as inmate in a house of prostitution for another person; or who shall, by
- 4. By promise, threats, violence, or by any device or scheme cause, induce, persuade or encourage an inmate of a house of prostitution to remain therein as such inmate; or who shall, by
- 5. By fraud, or artifice, or by duress of person or goods, or by abuse of any position of confidence or authority procure any other person to become a prostitute, or to enter;
- 6. Enter any place in which prostitution is encouraged or allowed within this state, or to come into this state or leave this state for the purpose of prostitution, or who shall procure;
- 7. Procure any other person, who has not previously practiced prostitution to become a prostitute within this state, or to come into this state or leave this state for the purpose of prostitution; or shall receive
- 8. Receive or give or agree to receive or give any money or thing of value for procuring or attempting to procure any other
