13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified							
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1992 of Title 63, unless there							
16	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:							
17	A. As used in this section:							
18	1. "Pharmacogenomics" means the study of how genetic factors							
19	will affect a person's response to certain medications, particularly							
20	adverse side effects;							
21	2. "Behavioral medication" means a medication capable of							
22	affecting the mind, emotions, behavior, activities and drugs used in							
23	the treatment of mental illness or brain activity;							

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3. "Nursing facility" and "specialized facility" mean a nursing facility and specialized facility as such terms are defined in Section 1-1902 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

- 4. "Assisted living center" means an assisted living center as the term is defined in Section 1-890.2 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- B. Every person who resides for more than thirty (30) days in a nursing facility, specialized facility or in an assisted living center, and who requires a prescription for a behavioral medication, shall have a pharmacogenomics profile conducted and recorded in the person's medical record.
- C. A pharmacogenomics profile shall include the results of at least eighteen genes tested and be accompanied by treatment guidance for each disease state tested. Each resident having such a test shall be entitled to receive a copy of the results or to view them in the medical record.
- D. Every nursing facility, specialized facility and assisted living center shall provide appropriate behavioral health services to each resident in need of such services to ensure the resident's physical, mental and psychosocial well-being. Any behavioral health services provided shall be in accordance with a comprehensive assessment and the resident's pharmacogenomics profile.
- E. The State Board of Health shall promulgate rules as necessary to implement the requirements of this section.
