6	AS INTRODUCED
7	An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.199, as amended by Section 1, Chapter
8	302, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 1210.199), which relates to cardiopulmonary
9	resuscitation instruction; deleting mandatory cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction for high
10	school students; deleting exceptions; updating language; moving definition; and providing an
11	effective date.

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.199, as
15	amended by Section 1, Chapter 302, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2017,
16	Section 1210.199), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 1210.199 A. This act shall be known and may be cited
18	as the "Dustin Rhodes and Lindsay Steed CPR Training Act".
19	B. Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, all students
20	enrolled in the public schools of this state shall receive
21	instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and awareness of the
22	purpose of an automated external defibrillator, in accordance with
23	subsection C of this section, at least once between ninth grade and
24	graduation from high school. The instruction may be provided as a

part of any course. A school administrator may waive the curriculum requirement required by this subsection for an eligible student who has a disability. A student shall not be required to meet the requirement of this subsection if a parent or guardian of the student objects in writing. All students enrolled in a virtual charter school in grades nine through twelve shall not be subject to the requirements of this section. All students enrolled in physical education classes in grades nine through twelve may receive instruction in the techniques of the Heimlich maneuver.

C. The State Board of Education shall establish a procedure for monitoring the requirements set forth in subsection B C of this section. Instruction Training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation shall incorporate psychomotor skills training and shall be based upon an instructional a program which is nationally recognized and is based upon the most current national evidence-based Emergency Cardiovascular Care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator. For purposes of this section, "psychomotor skills" means the use of hands-on practice to support cognitive learning.

 $\frac{D}{C}$. Each public school district board of education shall ensure that a minimum of one certified teacher and one noncertified staff member at each school site receives training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the Heimlich maneuver each year.

E. D. School districts may use state funds allocated to the school district for professional development to pay for or to reimburse teachers and support personnel for training in the administration of first aid and techniques of cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the Heimlich maneuver.

- F. E. Nothing in this section shall be construed to impose liability on any school district or school district employee for injury or death of any student, teacher, or other person resulting from any cardiopulmonary or choking incident or to absolve any school district or school employee of liability that might otherwise exist under The Governmental Tort Claims Act.
- G. For purposes of this section, "psychomotor skills" means the use of hands-on practice to support cognitive learning.
- H. F. A school district may use emergency medical technicians, paramedics, police officers, firefighters, teachers, other school employees or other similarly qualified individuals or organizations to provide the instruction training prescribed by this section. Two or more school districts may enter into an interlocal or multidistrict cooperative agreement for the purpose of jointly and comparatively fulfilling the requirements of this section.

 Instruction Training provided pursuant to this section is not required to result in certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. If instruction training is intended to result in certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation, the course
