HOUSE BILL 3685

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to insurance; requiring automobile liability insurer to pay certain claims within a certain time period; defining term; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1250.7A of Title 36, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

In the administration, servicing or processing of any policy of automobile liability insurance which provides for medical payments coverage, the insurer shall pay the amount of any basic medical expense claim due for injuries caused by a covered accident within sixty (60) calendar days after receipt of the claim by the insurer or any party in interest. As used in this section, "basic medical expense claim" means a claim for medical expenses that has no defect or impropriety, including a lack of any required substantiating

2 treatment that impedes prompt payment.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
