## **Research Analysis**

HB1031XX, as introduced, provides state approval for a new game offering under the State-Tribal Gaming Act. Tribes may elect to begin offering *non-house banked table games* by submitting a written supplement to an existing gaming compact with the state. The agreement requires the tribe to pay the state 10 percent of the monthly net wins of the common pool(s) or pot(s) from which prizes are paid *for non-house banked table games*.

The measure defines *non-house banked table games* as any table game, including but not limited to those table games involving a wheel, ball or dice, operated in a nonelectronic environment in which the tribe has no interest in the outcome of the game, including games played in tournament formats and games in which the tribe collects a fee from the player for participating, and all bets are placed in a common pool or pot from which all player winnings, prizes and direct costs are paid.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

Prior analysis provided by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) indicates the modification in gaming may produce additional state revenue. While the estimate continues to developed, the prior work indicated approximately \$22.0 million in added revenue initially.
